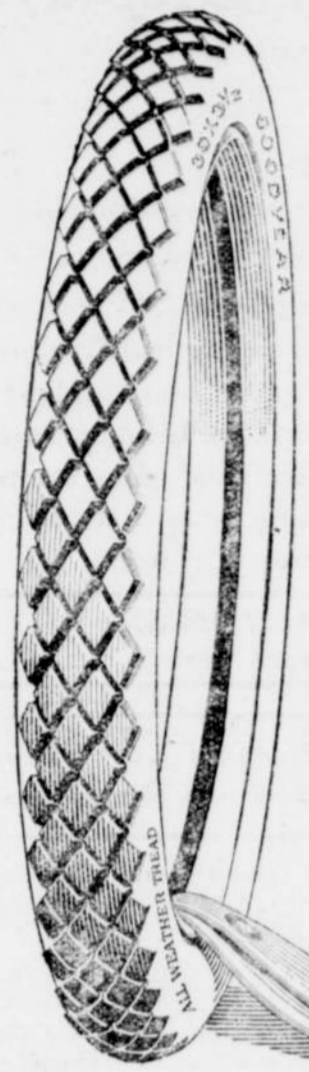

The United States circuit court of appeals has affirmed the decision of the Henry Albers case, which carries with it a fine of \$10,000 and three years imprisonment. It will be remembered that Albers, who is a wealthy miller of Portland, was arrested in the spring of 1917 while on a train coming from San Francisco, and charged with declaring he was a German sympathizer and attacked the government in no unstrained terms. At his trial in Portland he claimed he was drunk at the time of making the statements and had no recollection of them. When his appeal was taken he was released on a \$10,000 bond. It is expected he will now appeal to the United States supreme court.—Sheridan Sun.

Let Them Answer.

Mainly to emphasize the fact that the farmers have ideas of their own and are not to be made the tail to the political kite of the labor party, or any other party and are not to be used as catspaws in any disastrous scheme of the brotherhoods to tie up the railroads of the country, we reproduce two paragraphs from a memorial to congress submitted the other day by representatives of the National Grange, the American Farm Bureau Federation, the Cotton State Board and the Association of State Farmers Union, President:

"What would be the verdict of the people if the farmers of the United States should suddenly decide to go on a strike and refuse to supply the wants and needs of those who are not in a position to produce food and clothing for themselves? They would be condemned from one end of the country to the other, and the fact would be pointed out that they, as owners and tillers of the land had no right, either moral or legal, to bring about such a calamity. If the farmers who own and occupy the land have not such moral or legal right, then why should it be conceded by anyone that those who handle the farmers' products have a right to block the transportation or industrial facilities of the country and thus jeopardize the food and clothing supply of the nation? If the farmers have no such rights those who handle their products have no such right."

Will the gentlemen who purpose to paralyze the transportation system of the country please answer?—Oregonian.

Powdered Milk and Eggs.

Powdered milk and eggs can now be had which are wonderfully pure, clean and good. The way the milk is made is by forcing liquid milk through extremely small holes into a multi-lined chamber through which currents of hot dry air are constantly passing. The dry air coming in contact with the milky mist straightway absorbs the moisture it contains and the milk settles in powdery white drifts. Nothing has touched it but air. Nothing is changed. The powdered milk cannot sour on account of the almost total absence of moisture, and for the same reason no growth of bacteria can take place. The powder can be instantly transformed into fresh, sweet milk. If comes in cans; it can be kept anywhere, and in many climates is the only good milk obtainable. The rising cost of liquid milk is now making it profitable to use this dried milk. It retails at a price equivalent to 44 cents per quart for sweet milk or 8 cents per quart for skimmed milk. It is much appreciated in the tropics and also on ocean liners. The dried eggs are obtained presumably by the same method. Anyway, it is a fact that the best of omelets can be made from combined powdered milk and powdered eggs; for we have eaten them many times and never knew until our attention was called to the matter, that the eggs did not come freshly from the shells and the milk from the dairy. We believe that these dried foods have a great future before them, and are a valuable part of the preparation of mankind for the enjoyment of all kinds of food products of the New Age.—Golden Age.
