The May term of the circuit court convened on Monday, with Judge Bagely on the bench.

The grand jury is composed of: Garrett Ward, Eugene Atkinson, C. M. Vidito, J. C. Foster, G. E. Boquist, R. C. Magarell and J. C. Dunn.

The first jury case tried was that of Walter Oliver on a charge of adultery. The case was tried at the last term, but the jury failed to agree. There are two indictments against Oliver. The case went to the jury on Tuesday afternoon, which was out all night and failed to agree, so was discharged.

The second case was the Gaynes case, in which Maude Gaynes was suing Marion Gaynes for a divorce. A decree was granted.

An indictment has been made against Charles Blum, charged with involuntary manslaughter. His case will be tried in this term of court.

This contest being in the hands of all the school thru the efforts and interest of County Superintendent of School Mr. Geo. B. Lamb. Each school is trying hard for the prizes offered. The contest will close on the 14th of May and all the winning essays of each school should be in the office of Mr. Lamb that date, from where they will be sent to Mr. Westover, of the O. A. C. for final judging; then at a latter date to be announced, the prize winners will receive their rewards.

The essay contest will stimulate much interest among the schools of the county along the lines represented. The Babcock test should be placed in each school in the county; instructions given in its uses, then again the school could take up the matter of cow testing of all of the cows in the various localities, this would create much interest and tend to weed out the "boarders" of unproductive animals. The possibilities along this line are unlimited.
