



During the close down some of the saw mills will make neceasarly repairs. The shut down will mean that hundreds of men will be thrown out of employment within the next few weeks. Mill men complain that they have had more or less trouble in keeping men, some of whom work for a few days or a week or so and then quit, and a large proportion of that class will not do an honest day's work, hence the logging camps and saw mills are handicapped on that account.

There is no telling when milling activities will be resumed, as conditions all over the country are very unsettled, for there is a tightening up in the money market and in all lines of business.
