SENATOR UNDERWOOD ON WILSON'S REGIME

The Government Has Come to Be Too
Partisan and Too Much Like
A Football Party

Sen. Oscar Underwood, Democratic leader of the United States Senate does not seem to be entirely satisfied with the condition of the country under a Democratic administration. His speeches to World war veterans sound like a Republican attack. The Senator says: "The government has become the football of the partisan and the desire of the plunderer." And this sweeping declaration is made after seven years of Woodrow Wilson in the White House and seven years of the Democrats in the saddle.

Mr. Underwood, of Alabama, knows what he is talking about. Under the Wilson Democratic regime the Southern partisan and the Southern plunderer with others certainly have fattened upon the government of the funds that other bad conditions have arisen in the country. He says: "The war profiteer glories in his new wealth, and the high cost of living threatens the humble home." This all has occurred under the peerless idealist, Mr. Wilson and his Democratic leaders in Congress.

In short, in his talk to the returned soldiers Senator Underwood hit his party in a non-political speech good and hard. It was frank confession of Democratic failure in the administration of public affairs. Senator Underwood also was truly Democratic in that he proposed nothing remedial or compensatory to be done by the party so long in power for the lamentable condition in which the soldiers returning find the country for which they fought.

CENSUS OF OREGON GIVEN AS 783,285

Gain is 110,520. Or 16.4 Per Cent
For Decade.

Oregon has a population in 1920 of 783,285, which is a gain of 110,520 or 16.4 per cent over the 1910 figures of 672,765. It is impossible to compare this gain with the increase, if any, made by other western states because Oregon is the first western state on which the total has been announced.

It is not as high as the gain in the decade from 1910 to 1920 which was 259,229, or 62.7 per cent, but the growth of the entire west for that period was unusual. Nowhere in the west will there be any repetition of the population gains shown in 1920. Oregon's rate of increase is larger than that of Georgia or Delaware, the only two other states whose 1920 census has been announced. Georgia's increase was 10.9 per cent and Delaware's 10.2 per cent.

Oregon Ninth In Area.
Oregon in 1910, ranked as 35th most populous state in the union. It showed an increase of 259,229 or 62.7 per cent in the 10 years ending with 1920, having had the largest growth numerically in its history, the number being almost double that of any previous decade.

In area, Oregon ranked as ninth largest state in the union in 1910 with a land area of 95,607 square miles making its population average 7 per square mile.

Oregon was organized as a territory in 1848 and appears in the federal census reports for the first time in 1850. Its population then was 13,294 which includes 1201 returned from that portion which was taken in 1853 to form Washington territory. During each decade from 1850 to 1910 Oregon showed a rapid growth, the lowest rate of increase for any decennial period being 30.2 per cent for the decade 1890-1900.

The most rapid rate of growth was during the first few years in the history of the state, the population increasing three-fold from 1850 to 1860. During the following three decades, 1860-90, the population of the state increased more than five-fold, the percentages of increase ranging from 73.3 to 92.2 per cent. Between 1890 and 1910 the population more than doubled. The numerical increase in the decade 1900-10 was nearly one and a half times the entire population of the state in 1880.

Comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States shows that during every decade the growth of the state was more rapid than the growth of the country as a whole. The population of the state in 1910 was somewhat more 50 times as large as in 1850, while the population of the

United States in 1910 was slightly less than four times that in 1850. Tillamook 8776, increase 40.1 per cent.

Deschutes, a new county which permits of no comparison for 1910, 9632.
Linn, 24,550; increase of 1888 or 8.3 per cent.
Jackson, 20,405; increase of 5351 or 20.8 per cent.
Multnomah, 275,898; increase of 49,637 or 21.9 per cent.
Umatilla, 25,898; increase of 5637 or 27.8 per cent.
Klamath, 11,413; increase of 2859 or 33.4 per cent.
Lake, 3991; decrease of 667 or 14.3 per cent.
Union, 16,636; increase of 445 or 2.7 per cent.

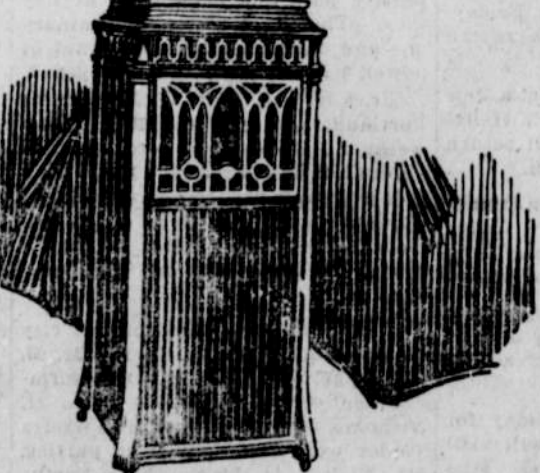
