**TILLAMOOK COUNTY AND TUBERCULAR FREE AREA**

**Government and State Veterinarians Visit Tillamook and Meet Dairymen**

Dr. W. H. Lytle, State Veterinarian of Oregon and Dr. Sam B. Foster, Inspector in charge, Tuberculosis Eradication in Oregon and Washington for the United States Department of Agriculture, were here for a few days last week in connection with the placing of Tillamook county in what is known as a "Tubercular Free Area." Accompanied by Dr. E. L. Glaisyer, Tillamook county Herd Inspector, Dr. Lytle and Foster visited and consulted with a number of dairymen in the vicinity and also conducted a check test upon the pure bred Holstein herd of F. R. Beale. A meeting was called on Wednesday evening at the courthouse and which was attended by a number of our representative dairymen. Dr. Foster explained at length the operation of the plan under which it will be possible for Tillamook county to be placed in the Tubercular Free Area. Ordinarily, the government offered its cooperation to breeders of pure bred cattle individually, which, after a certain number of tests showed no reacting cattle within them, were classed as a "Federal Accredited Herd," and was considered as free from tuberculosis. Tillamook county being the only county in the United States to be working under a State law compelling the testing once a year of all cattle, was placed in the individual, as a county, similar to the position in other places and the only process necessary to obtain this tubercular free rating will be the testing once only of the cattle by a regularly employed veterinarian of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Inasmuch as Dr. Glaisyer has tested all the cattle in county at least once, Dr. Foster has promised to place one of the Government Veterinarians in this county soon, who will run a check test upon all the herds tested by Dr. Glaisyer, and at the end of his testing will issue notice to the effect that Tillamook county is designated by the United States Department of Agriculture as free from Bovine Tuberculosis. This Government in its announcements, in all the various farm and dairy journals and can be placed upon the face of every Tillamook cheese.

The test used will be similar to the test now employed in this work by Dr. Glaisyer, the "caudal intradermal" test, and has recently been placed by the Government as the most reliable test. In herds where a number of reacting cattle may be found it will probably be wise to supplement this with a combination of tests. It is expected that a very few tubercular cattle will be found in the erds of Tillamook county owing to their having had a number of tests in the past. The great value of the cooperation of the Federal government in this work and the ultimate value to the cheese industry of our county by reason of having Tillamook county designated as Tubercular Free, can hardly be estimated, and credit can be given to Dr. Glaisyer, who has been working toward this end since taking up the testing of the cattle of Tillamook county. Dr. Glaisyer states that he expects the Government Veterinarian will be in Tillamook county this coming week.

**Death of John Larson**

John Larson was born in Usserod, Denmark, in 1836, and died at Bay City, August 5th, 1920. He was an

old timer in this part of the county, as he came to Tillamook in 1866, having resided at Bay City the greater part of the time since. He has no relatives in the United States, and the funeral was held the day following his death, Rev. A. A. McRea, of the Presbyterian church of this city conducted the services. Interment was made at the Bay City cemetery.

**John R. Murphy Speaks At K. C. Smoker**

Murphy, a prominent Portland attorney spent the better part of an hour in speaking of the Knight of Columbus, their foundation, growth, and different activities both in times of peace and in times of war. He finished his speech by giving the different reasons why every Catholic gentleman should join the Knights and an invitation for all prospective candidates to fill out their application. With a bound Louis Weber rose to his feet, followed in quick succession by Frank Von Eaw, Peter Betschart, Martin Berns, A. Hurlimann, Louis Reding and Joe Von Roex. Including the Wheeler and Cloverdale campaigns, this makes some twenty candidates for the next initiation. The "smoker" was brought to a close with the serving of refreshments by the ladies and an unanimous appeal for another "smoker" in the near future.
