

ANOTHER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE LAUNCHED IN CITY

Board of Seven Members Will Have The Management.

Another Chamber of Commerce was launched in this city on Thursday evening, at a meeting of the business men at the city hall, and it is hoped that the new organization will have sufficient stability and staying power to remain on the job for a number of years before it gives up the ghost.

That Tillamook City has been a "dead one," as far as a commercial body is concerned for a number of years, but there is now an awakening of the dead bones to life and activity. Notwithstanding about 50 business men had signed up, less than 20 put in an appearance Thursday evening, but those who were present showed their interest in matters pertaining to the future development of Tillamook city and county.

The organization will be managed by a board of seven directors, and those who were elected Thursday were: H. H. Rosenberg, C. J. Edwards, R. B. Miller, W. J. Reichers, F. A. Beltz, H. Crenshaw and Fred C. Baker. The board will elect the officers.

Several matters were talked over. B. Miller strongly urging the advisability of procuring an aviation field. R. W. Watson complained that the work on the Bayocean road had been stopped and advocated its completion as soon as possible, for it seemed a little strange after money had been provided for completing the road it had not been done. Road-master Carol stated that they expected to put a steam shovel to work the coming winter, but it appears to be the intention of a number of business men to interview the county court and urge the speedy completion of the road.

The matter of a road between Lincoln and Yamhill counties was brought up by C. J. Edwards, who showed the necessity of the road and which he thought would form part of the Roosevelt Highway.

The board of directors met on Monday evening at the city when the following officers and chairmen of committees were elected:

President, Fred C. Baker; Vice-president, H. H. Rosenberg; Secretary and treasurer, W. J. Reichers; Manager, Leslie Harrison; Chairman Industrial committee, H.

H. Rosenberg, Chairman Traffic, Transportation and waterways committee, F. A. Beltz, Chairman Mercantile and Agriculture committee, H. Crenshaw, Chairman Legislation and Taxation committee, C. J. Edwards, Chairman Tourist, Publicity and Convention committee, R. B. Miller, Chairman Social and Civic committee, W. J. Reichers, Chairman Administration, Membership and Finance committee, Fred C. Baker.

Between now and the next meeting of the board of directors Manager Harrison was instructed to round up every business and professional man in the city and enroll them as members, for it is hoped that the membership will amount to 200 the next few weeks.

The board had under discussion the matter of water transportation, and decided to cooperate with the timber owners and dairymen who have under consideration the matter of better harbor improvements. The Board decided to employ a stenographer to help the committee that was appointed to procure data in regard to amount of freight that is shipped in and out of the county on the railroad and what it costs, and what it would cost with a boat service. An effort will be made to raise \$5,000 for publicity work in Tillamook.

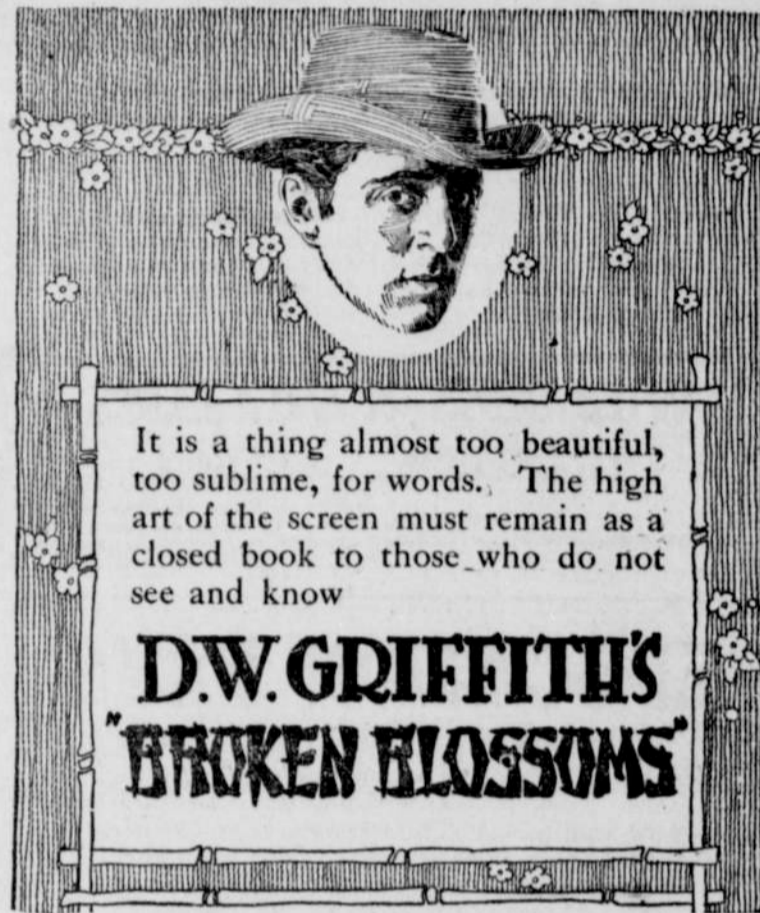

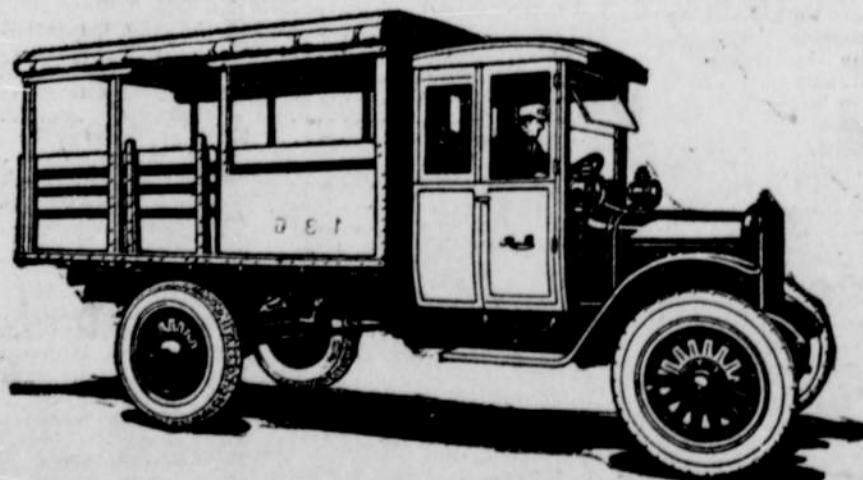

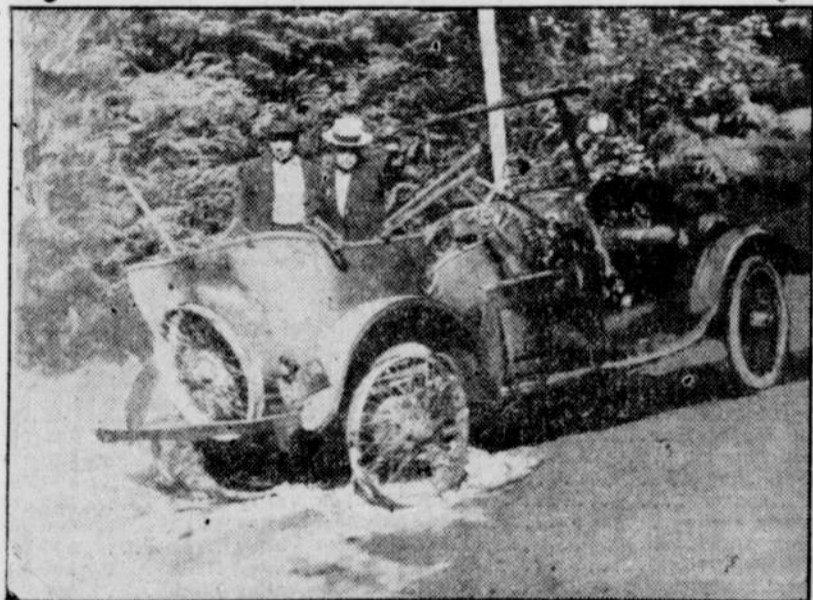
