Up goes the high cost of living once more. Passenger fares on the Southern Pacific, between Tillamook and Portland are raised again. This time they jump from \$4.60 to \$5.53.

The new fire engine paid for itself early Tuesday morning, when a few fire traps came near wiping out some portion of the business section. It is our candid opinion that had the firemen been dependent upon the old system of fighting fire, several business blocks would be in ashes today.

The Tillamook County Fair this year will have one of the best stock exhibits of pure bred stock in the history of the county, thanks to the progressive spirit of the three breeding associations and those who are

desirous of making this a most important section of the Northwest for pure bred dairy stock. For that reason every dairyman in the county should attend the county fair this year and rub up against the pure bred stock boosters, and in doing so a large amount of useful information can be obtained, for all the live wires will be there to enlighten dairymen who need some intelligent information.

Senator Chamberlain admits that this is a republican year, and, on that account, he appears to be uneasy. This is what is worrying George. Republicans are going to line up for republican candidates and they are going to vote for a republican for president and a republican for U.S. senator, which is Harding and Stanfield. It would place Oregon in the wrong pew to have a democrat represent the state of Oregon in the U. S. senate with a republican administration.

In the death of Coleman H. Wheeler, this county lost a man who had a large amount of western grit, perseverance and determination in endeavoring to make a success of the lumber business on Nehalem bay. It was in need of his improvements, with bad weather conditions in the winter that he butted up again and although his ingenuity devised many plans for getting lumber to market, he was met with many disappointments and losses.

We wish to say a few words about the managements of our county fair, not, however, in a critical spirit, but more in the nature of obtaining better co-operation. Of course, it is generally admitted that the Grange should take a lively interest in the county fair, for without their assistance it would not amount to much by way of agriculture display, which is one of the pleasing features.

The fire early Tuesday morning should teach our citizens two valua-

ble lessons. One is that all frame buildings should be eliminated from the business section; and the second is that no private hospital should be allowed to locate and do business in fire trap buildings, in the heart of the city. Had the fire obtained a little more headway on Tuesday morning the patients in the hospital stood some chances of being roasted alive.

Death of Coleman H. Wheeler

Coleman H. Wheeler, prominent pioneer lumberman of Oregon and a resident of Portland for a number of years died suddenly Saturday night at his home, 415 Montgomery drive, death being due to cerebral hemorrhage. Mr. Wheeler had gone to his office in the Yeon building as usual Saturday, but had complained of not feeling well and about 5 o'clock left his office for home.

Mr. Wheeler was born in Ontario, Canada in 1865 and came to Oregon as a young man, entering the lumber business. He continued in this business throughout his life, acquiring large holdings and carving a place for himself as one of the most prominent and progressive lumber operators of the state.

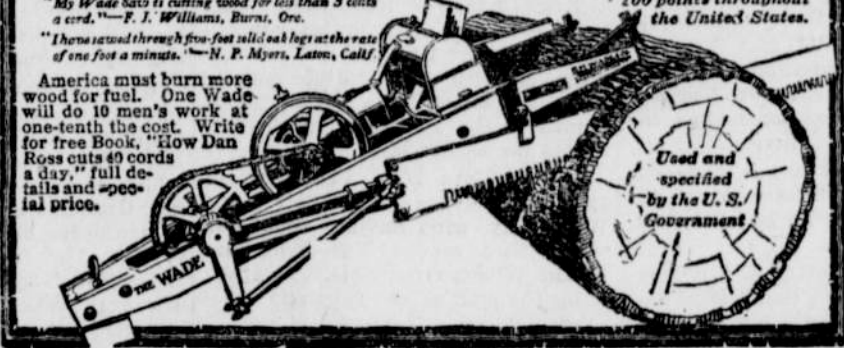
