CITY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS SECTION I:

Fourth Street, and running thence North along the center of Stillwell Avenue to the center of Second First Avenue West; thence North to the center of the Southern Pacific railroad track; thence Easterly along the center line of the Southern Pacific on conviction thereof, be punished by Street; thence West to the center of center line of the SouthernPacific Railroad track to a point in the center of Fourth Avenue East, ectended; thence South to Fourth Street; thence West to the place of beginning, is hereby declared to be within the fire limits of Tillamook Such fine. Any person, firm or corporation desiring to raise, lower, alter or repair any wooden building or structure within the fire limits of TillaIn the matter of the estate of P. mook City, or to construct a wooden residence or private garage within such limits as by this ordinance al-lowed, shall, before commencing to do any such work, file with the common council an application for permission therefor, and such application shall designate the location of such building or structure, and the extent to which it is to be raised or lowered, or the extent and character of the alter-ration or repair desired to be made, and in case of the construction of a new wooden building, the location proposed, and a statement showing the ther buildings adjacent thereto within the distance herein specified for such wooden buildings. If upon in-vestigation the Common Council shall I she proposed raising, lowering, ering or repairing to be of such character as not to increase the in-flammability of the building or struc-ture, and to not make the same less sanitary, and to not amount to a substantial rebuilding of such build-ing or structure, or increase fire risk to surrounding property, and in car-of the construction of a wooden build-

ing as hereby permitted, to be of the character and in accord with the provisions of this ordinance in regard thereto, permission shall be granted.

Provided, however, that no such permission shall be given in any case.

SECTION III No building, except a residence or private garage, shall hereafter be erected within, or moved into the fire limits described in Section I. of this Ordinance, unless the same shall have their outside and party walls made of brick, stone or other incombustible materials, and such outside or party walls shall extend from the foundation to the top of, and through the roof of same, and the roof shall be covered with tin or some other incombustible material, and the walls thereof shall be so constructed as to separate all woodwork of such buildings from the

SECTION IV It shall be unlawful to erect or place any wooden building or struc-ture within the fire limits of Tilladoing in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance.

SECTION VA A wooden building within the meaning of this Ordinance is a building or structure the exterior walls of which, or any portion thereof, are construct-ed of wood. Wooden frames covered with metal shall be deemed to be wood




