SPECIAL ELECTION

For seven years the different fair boards have arranged and conducted a county fair in Tillamook. They began very modestly, for their first attempt was held in a livery stable. Our county fair has developed from a very small beginning to the most important county gathering of the year. A few years ago a tract just east of Tillamook city was leased from the Southern Pacific company for fair purposes and since then that place has been used for fair grounds. But the lease has expired and the railroad company is liable to want their property at any time. It is possible that the fair board could get the property for a year or so longer but they would eventually have to move out and any improvements made on the place in the meantime would be lost, while, in fact, the tract is too small for the purpose for which it has been used. A special election has been called for the purpose of authorizing the county court to assess a 1 mill tax for the purchase and improvement of 80 acres of land about two miles east of Tillamook city on the Fairview pavement, to be used for fair purposes. Tentative plans for stock and exhibit buildings, airplane field and race track, and a baseball and athletic field have been considered. Provision may also be made for a tourist camping park, for there is a natural grove of young spruce and all that would be necessary to convert it into a park would be to cut drive-ways through the trees. There is a very good site for an airplane field and Tillamook should have one for the airplane is due to become as important a factor in transportation here as it has become elsewhere. The Wilson River Water company has the pipeline to supply the place with a good main with a plentiful supply of the best water. The location of the proposed grounds is convenient, the purchase price reasonable and the grounds alone are very attractive. With all these advantages taken together we urge the voters to go to the polls next Monday and cast their ballot for 300 Yes.

BUILDING ORDINANCE

It has been brought to our attention that quite a few of the property owners of Tillamook city are unaware that a building restriction ordinance has been passed embracing the business section of our town. Through the measure has been published in our local papers and considerable publicity has been given its passage by the council, we have some people with us who do not know anything about it. It is for the section of the city bounded on the west by Stillwell Avenue, on the south by Fourth street, on the east by Fourth avenue, and on the north by the Southern Pacific railroad tracks. It is unlawful to construct any wooden buildings within the limits as above set forth, or to alter or repair any such wooden buildings already within the limits of the restriction without a permit from the common council. All persons contemplating build-

ing or repairing their buildings would do well to get a copy of the ordinance from the city recorder for their guidance.
