in Hospitals. The full utility of many hospitals is now impaired by a lack of nurses

writes "Girard" in the Philadelphia Howard Butler, Jr., is trustee of an important hespital here and he tells

me they need 30 per cent more nurses than they can get. "Why are nurses so scarce?"

"I presume," answered Mr. Butcher whose business, as you know, is that of a banker and broker, "it is because girls think they can earn more money in an easier way in some other occupation.'

I have talked with doctors of wide hospital experience about it and they say that the old practice of making girls in training for nurses do drudgery for a year or so has prevented many young women from entering the "What good." said one great sur-

geon, "did it do to a nurse's skill to make her scrub floors or wash windows? As well make medical students polish shoes, keep up the furnace fires and sweep out the lecture rooms."

Another physician of long experience and who is connected with a big hospital, added:

"The hospitals will be obliged to cut out the manual labor for training nurses and will probably reduce the years of training, or the country will go back to the conditions when it had few or no trained nurses."
