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**SAME OLD THING.**

Tuesday night at the Chamber of Commerce meeting the business men of the town showed the same old failing that has held the community down to the position of a one-horse village that it has occupied for so many years in spite of the wonderful natural advantages that have always been ours.

Representatives of a firm which has been very successful in the canning industry were on hand to put up the proposition of building a fruit cannery in the county and of putting under cultivation many acres of land here for loganberries. The members attending the meeting haggled for hours on subjects that could have been disposed of in a few minutes; the cannery project was held up for the last thing and never did come up for discussion on account of the late hour. The meeting adjourned and the cannery representatives were not given any chance to state their proposition.

The proceedings were entirely disgusting to any one who observed it from an impartial standpoint and we can see no relief from such things until some new blood is injected into our public organizations. The affair Tuesday night was a rank discourtesy to those who wish to bring business into the community.

**MORE FREAK LAWS.**

Considerable publicity has been given to the efforts of a few agitators in the East to have enacted the so-called "Sunday Blue Laws." It is presumed that these measures are intended to force church attendance upon those who are not now members or who are not steady church goers.

No more pernicious a form of legislation could be passed than that which contemplates religious bondage. To force religious belief on any person is to take away his personal liberty, and liberty is the corner stone of this country. Take away our right to worship God as we see fit and the next step is to place a monarch upon a throne as ruler of the United States.

Compulsory religious laws have been tried out many times in history and have always brought rebellion and anarchy in the place of the results sought for. An unpleasant religion has always followed in the wake of any attempt of the clergy to rule. Thus it will always be.

Oregon and Washington are the only states of the Union which have not now some form of Sunday laws and it is the duty of every liberty loving citizen of Oregon to discourage from the start the efforts of any sect or class who attempt to set up any laws for religious bondage in our state.

We believe that the greater majority of ministers of the gospel are decidedly not in favor of any law tending to force church attendance or Sunday restraint to the extent that the Blue Laws call for. Those sponsoring the attempted legislation are no doubt of the fire-and-brimstone class who still imagine that anyone who does not belong to their particular denomination or sect is condemned to eternal damnation.

**BEAL'S TIMBER BILL.**

The bills introduced in the legislature by Representative Beal pertaining to the valuation of timber lands no doubt has for its purpose the best interests of the community, but as the measure is drawn up it looks to us as though the construction is weak.

In reality it gives the county assessors very little advantage over what they now have in that the assessor already have authority to reassess any valuations which do not seem to be just.

If the measure passes it will, at the most, give county officials the power to call upon timber owners for a cruise of their holdings, a cruise which they have no way of knowing is exact, leaving the matter up to the judgement of the assessors and the boards of equalization as is now done.

The county cruise that was taken some years ago declared to be inaccurate. If this is the case and the people are not satisfied with the valuations now set upon the timber lands let them, by election, vote funds for another county cruise that will be exact, and not depend upon the owners of the property for a statement of the values.

If there is any anxiety about getting through some helpful timber legislation this term why not introduce a measure requiring the timber companies to reforest the logged off lands. A large amount of the land now being logged off will never be fit for anything but timber and this might be a good solution of the waste land problems in Tillamook County. Some think that certain sections would be able to produce berries. Possibly so, but berries require cultivation and nothing but a billiard ball will spend much time on some of our hillsides. To attempt to solve the logged off land problem by optimistically planning to put it all under berry cultivation is absurd.
