Paris.-Germans to the number of 1,965 have succeeded in obtaining per mission to reside here, according to the Prefecture of Police registration of foreigners in Paris. Italians lead the list with 41,350, while the United States is fifth with 23,630. Other na tienals include 36,660 Belgians, 29,000 Swiss, 27,650 English, 23,000 Russiant and 14,000 Poles. There are 88 Aus trians and 254 Bulgarians besides 7, 892 South and Central Americans.
