

3,473,466 JOBS LOST IN YEAR

United States Department of Labor Makes Survey of Employment Conditions.

INDUSTRIES HAVE SLOWED UP

Figures Represent Reduction of 35.5 Per Cent in Employment—Largest Percentage of Reduction in Automobiles and Accessories.

Washington.—American industries on January 1 employed 3,473,466 fewer workers than they did in January a year ago, so the United States Department of Labor announced. The figures were based upon a nation-wide survey of unemployment conditions made by a staff of experts between December 15, 1920, and January 15.

No Lives Lost in the Civil Service

Records Show a Total of 3,156,300 Misses—Many Minor Accidents and Fatal Losses.

New York.—A total of 116,268 persons have been killed in accidents during the last 10 months without the loss of a single life in the manufacturing, mining or construction industry. This has been based on the percentage of accidents which are reported to the Bureau of Census, and it is believed that the number of persons killed in the other 100,000,000 accidents occurring in this country were about the same.

In the absence of any federal agency of inspection, air line and railway carriers are turning to the Department of Commerce for help. The department is now studying the situation and has issued a series of regulations which will be effective in the near future.

Michigan Hardest Hit

Michigan is shown to be the hardest hit. The working force in the plants is reduced 82 per cent from one year ago. Of the other big industrial states, Indiana and Ohio come next.

By industrial groups, the largest percentage of reduction as compared with a year ago occurred in automobiles and accessories, which indicated a 69 per cent drop in employment.

This industry a year ago employed about 8 per cent of the total number in all industry. Second comes the building trades with a reduction of 52 per cent.

Twelve months ago these crafts employed about 11 per cent of all workers in industry. Next comes textiles and clothing, hosiery and underwear, with a curtail of 35 1/2 per cent in employment; leather, boots and shoes, 32 per cent below last year; metals, machinery, electric goods and foundry products, 30 1/2 per cent off; clay, glass, cement and stone, 19 per cent; packing and food products, 19 per cent below last January.

Jobless by Cities

In 182 industrial cities the estimated employment in industry was placed at 2,802,755. Numerically New York led the cities in volume of unemployment. It was placed at 254,243. Detroit had a reduction in working force of 160,000.

Chicago's number of jobless in industry was given as 80,000. The Indiana Harbor district has 26,000. Cleveland has 81,000 fewer men in the shops, Philadelphia, 70,000; Baltimore, 80,500.
