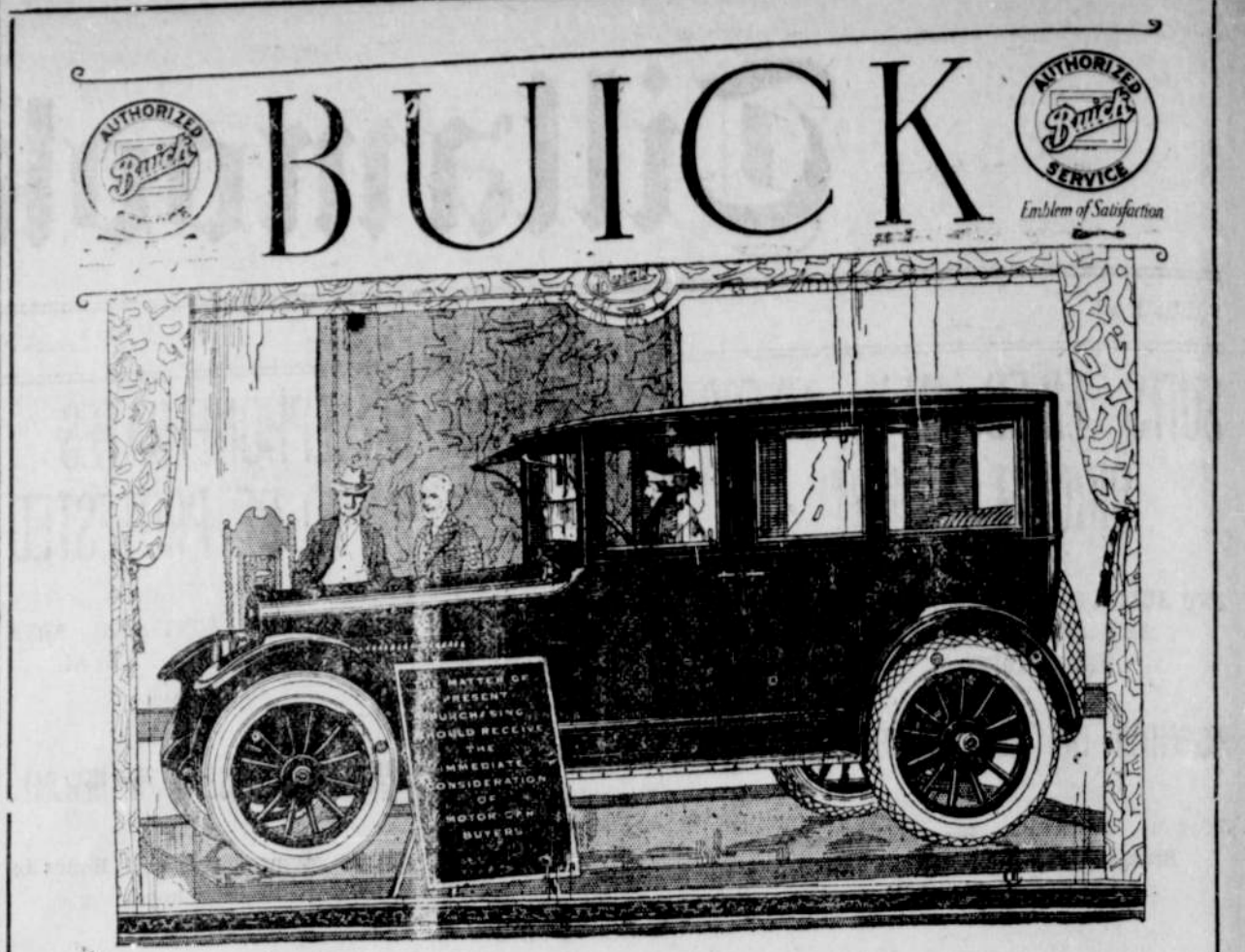

RAT IN HOUSE TO COST \$20. British Law Imposes This Fine for First Offense; After That \$77.70. London.—Anybody discovered harboring a rat or a mouse in his house is liable to a penalty of £5 (\$19.425 at current exchange) under a law recently enacted by parliament. If the "offense" is continued he may be fined £20 (\$77.70). Lieut. Alfred E. Moore astonished a London audience by making these statements in a lecture on "Rats," which he delivered the other day. The reason why so few prosecutions had yet taken place under the "rat act," as it was termed, was because the board of agriculture was waiting until the public became more familiar with it.
