The high school boys could not find the basket while Morrison of Wilson River converted several "fluke" shots. Close guarding was in evidence on both sides. This victory for Wilson River ties the two teams for the county championship and a post season championship game will be staged Friday night on the high school floor. This game promises to be fast and the support of the students and public is desired.

The committee in charge is doing all in its power to make the affair a success; plan are being carried out by Art Harris, general manager of the "Carnival" to make this night one long remembered in the history of Tillamook.
