What is the matter with the American public nowadays? Every one is looking at everybody else suspiciously and wondering if he is going to get the money for the goods he let go on account.

What do our "hard times" consist of? Mainly a tightening up of credit. There is no real depression.

Are the American people so easily thrown off their mental equilibrium that a hard times scarecrow can send them into a near panic?

If this depression scare were traced to its beginning it would be found that it is entirely a psychological condition brought about by a few "scare" stories. Such a thing, if allowed to continue, can cause real damage.

Unfortunately our city government is sometimes embarrassed by cantankerous individuals who delight in stirring up all the molestation they they possibly can on the slightest excuse. A great and wonderful spirit must repose within the venal form of such a person to cause him to persevere in his efforts routing out and bringing to the bright light of public knowledge every slight breach of technicality upon the part of our city or county officials.

Think of all the virtuous acts of people such as these; think of the magnificent service they are to their neighbors and think of what their future reward should be. It is astounding to consider. Let us try not to ponder over it too long for fear of exhaustion. If these certain individuals sometimes forget to pay their bills or overlook some other so-called earthly matter, do not cause them to pause for on single moment but let

Tillamook has turned down many good opportunities in the past and has certainly lost thereby. Don't let this sort of thing go on forever.

Lincoln County has the same climatic conditions and soil conditions as Tillamook County and it might produce the same kind of cheese and have the same kind of dairymen's organization. There is a similar organization now being formed in Lincoln County by J. E. Cooter and some of the farmers. The answer is Tillamook record.
