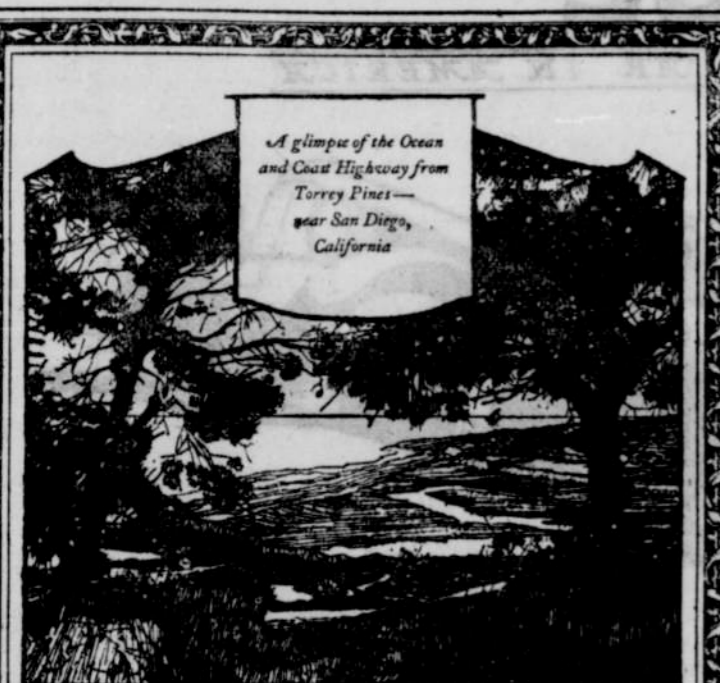

### Poisonous Plants of Tillamook County

(By E. L. Glaisyer)

**Poison toad stools:** This fungus  
growth is found quite generally all  
over the country. The poison is used  
as the base of poisonous fly paper.  
Symptoms: Frothing at the mouth,  
staggering gait, coma and death.  
Seen in summer.

**Oregon water hemlock:** This is  
found in springs and boggy places.  
It is very poisonous, and has a root-  
stock with several branching root-  
lets. Grows to a height of four feet,  
has green ribbed hollow stems,  
spreading in an umbrella like expan-  
sion of white flowers. Most of the  
poison is in the roots but the tops  
are also very poisonous. Symptoms:  
Violent convulsions, frothing at the  
mouth and nose, excessive urinations,  
shallow breathing and coma. Seen  
in early spring or from slough hay  
in winter.

**Larkspur:** This is found along the  
streams and in the meadows. Grows  
to a height of several feet and has a  
rather broad geranium like leaf. It  
has white and light blue spur like  
flowers. Poisonous before and at  
flowering time. Symptoms: Strag-  
gling gait in hind legs, involuntary  
movements of muscles, violent spasms  
easily frightened, appetite good until  
death. Seen in May and June.
