Improved Lighting System.

The advantages of electric lamps that can be moved about from one place to another may now be considered in installing the lighting system in the home or elsewhere. The nev system requires no cord connection, but a novel type of plug, to be used with a special outlet, gives portability not only to the lamp buil, but to the entire fixture. The outlets are located in the parts of the room or establishment where occasional as well as permanent lighting may be desirable. The plug has curved blades instead of the ordinary straight ones, and is easily attached to any fixture. The outlet has two parallel slots in a rounded triangular center. As the plug is inserted with the curved blades pointing upward, electrical and mechanical connection are formed, and the heaviest household fixture is safely supported. The outlet will also receive the standard parallel-blade plug used with cord connections. To change a lamp from its regular one it is simply necessary to lift the fixture from its old location and plug it into the desired outlet.

Herds of "Tame" Buffalo Have Much in Common With Their Brethren Who Have Freedom.

The "tame" buffalo of Yellowstone 414t5 National Park, are tame only in the manner of speaking. They-retain all the habits of the original wild species. For instance, they are able, without fail, to predict a heavy storm for one or two days in advance. As the buffalo of the old plains were known to do, they point the storm, standing with the head toward the point from which it afterward breaks. Another sign of uneasiness induced by heavy weather is the stiff-legged leaping and running about in circles which often mark the herd just before a storm breaks on their range. They live practically in all respects the wild life of the so-called wild herd of the park with the exception that they are watched by horsemen and are fed hay during the most inclement weather of the winter. The ranges of the tame and wild herds overlap to some extent, and without doubt they occasionally interbreed. The original hope, which has not been realized, was that some of the tame herd would drift off and become members of the wild herd.


