The official cow test for April has been completed and the report follows: Secretary, Paul Fitzpatrick; Tester Peters & Hall. Average pounds of milk per cow, 1093, Average pounds of butterfat per cow, 44.72. Number of cows tested during month, 926. Number of cows producing over 40 pounds of fat, 573. Three high pure bred herds are: Owner, John Schild, 17cows, 1565, are rounds of milk each. 19.20 are rounds of fat each; Homer Mason 1565 av. pounds of milk each, 49.20, av. pounds of fat each; Homer Mason owner, 12 cows, 1000lbs. av. milk per cow, 47.00 av.pounds of fat each.

of milk each, 64.57 lbs. of fat each; Durrer Bros., owner 23 cows, 1461 lbs. of milk each, 64.29 lbs. of fat each; Clyde Kinnaman, owner, 12 cows, 1324 lbs. of milk each, 58.27 lbs. of fat each.

Three unprofitable cows have been disposed of. Several bulls and a number of cows and heifers were purchased at a sale of outside Jerseys. Three milking machines installed, one discarded.


