Section 10 .- Any person or persons knowingly or willfully violating any of the provisions of this act less than fifty dollars (\$56) nor Everybody welcome. more than one hundred dollars (\$100), or by imprisonment for not less than thirty days nor more than six months, or by fine and imprisonment, for each offense. Justice of the peace shall have jurisdiction over cases tried under this law, and is hereby made the duty of the District Attorney of the county in which any violation takes place to prose cute in this action.


