Joseph Seval returned home this week for his summer vacation. He has been attending the University of Washington at Seattle.

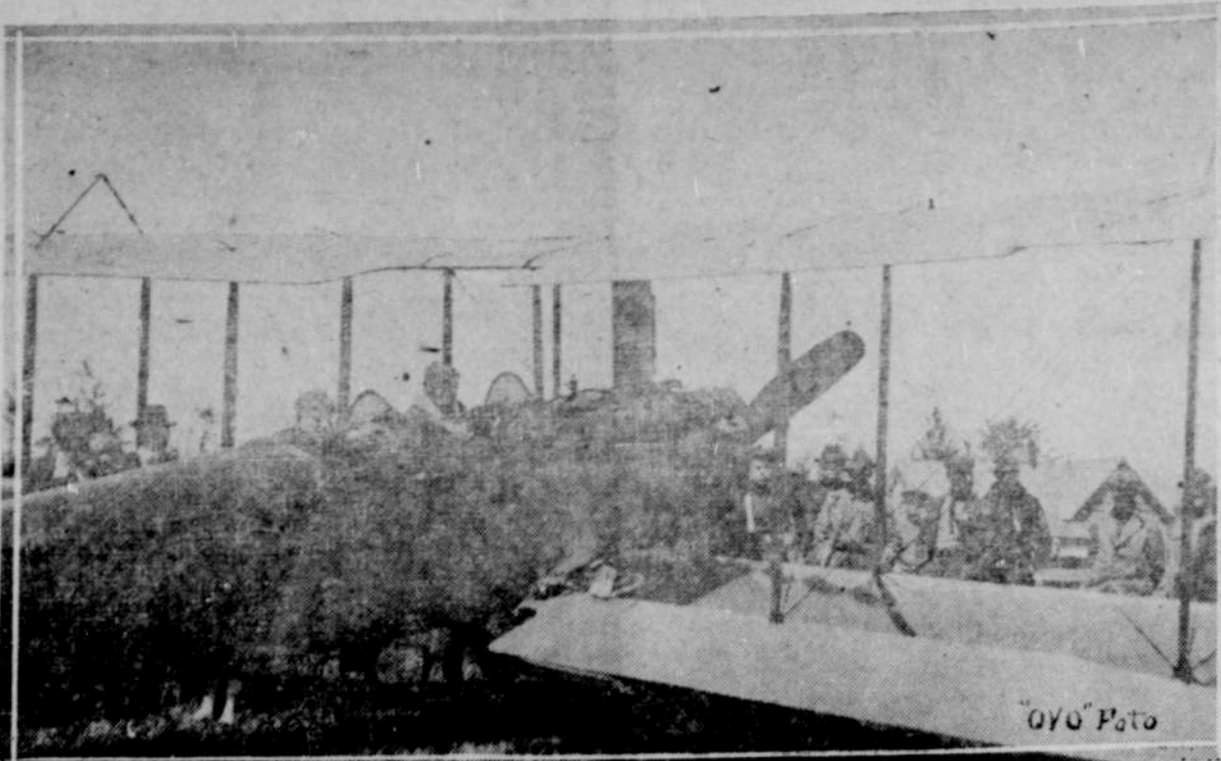
L. B. Ziemer, deputy dairy and food inspector and in charge of the cheese factories of Oregon, is a Tillamook visitor this week.

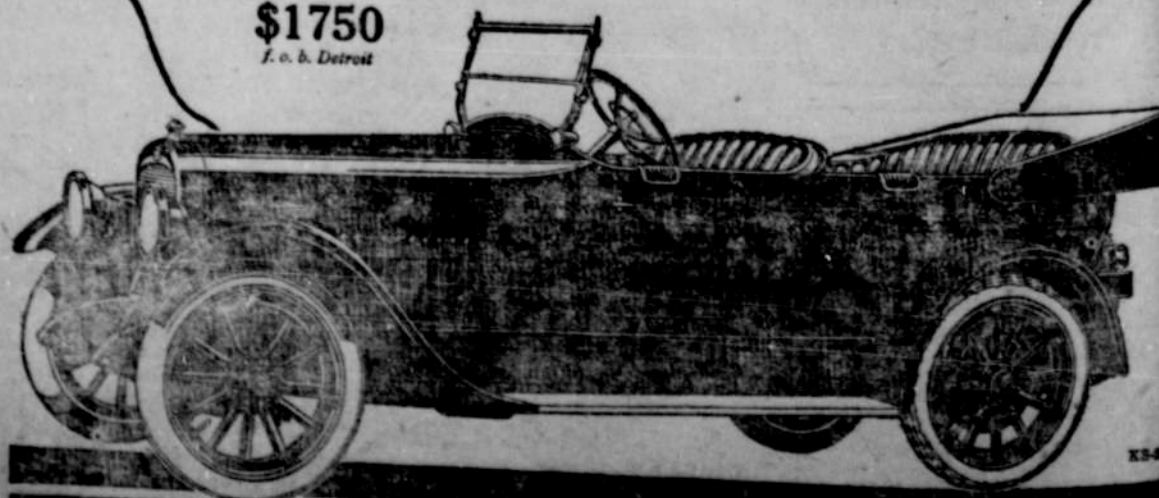
