SWIMMING TANK NOTES
The swimming tank in the gymnasium has proved so popular during the past three weeks that the board finds it necessary to open it an extra night to accommodate the public. The new schedule, which went into effect Monday June 20, is as follows:
Monday, Ladies night; Tuesday, Public night; Wednesday, Water changed, tank closed; Thursday, open only to married people and those of their children who can not swim. Friday night, Public night.
It is planned that Thursday night will give parents an opportunity to teach their younger children to swim when the tank is free from the large number of swimmers who children who can swim will be usually there. To this end children who can swim will not be admitted at this time. Only married people will be admitted this night.
The water in the tank will be changed Wednesdays and Fridays, and the tank thoroughly cleaned. The water as it is admitted to the tank is treated with a strong disinfectant. People having toxic skin diseases, etc., are not to be admitted to the tank.
