fire. It is stated that he carried insurance to cover nearly all his loss, and that the hotel will probably be rebuilt in the near future.

The origin of the fire is not positively known but some think that it may have been started by boys with fire crackers while others believe that someone dropped a cigarette butt in the refuse of the stable.

There are two peculiar quirks connected with the fire. One was that two small United States flags which were used on one of the buildings opposite the fire for decorations were unharmed though the paint and wood of this same building was badly scorched. Another incident is stated of one of the men who slept in the confectionery store directly across the street from the flames that he was not wakened by the noise and tumult of the fire and the efforts of the volunteers to curb it and was very much surprised next morning to look across the street and find his neighbors burned out.

A crew is busy on the Netarts road dragging and repairing plank. The contractors laying pavement on the Netarts road was very much handicapped by the rain, but is about half through at this time. Operations start at Simmons creek plant Monday morning crushing rock to complete the Yellow Fir cutoff.

The steam shovel below Beaver is making good progress in the heavy work in that neighborhood and will soon be done. Work will start next week placing a concrete wall to protect what is known as the Saling grade from the ravages of the Nestucca river.

#### Conder Bridge Work Continued

The state highway commission has re-let the contract for the erection of the steel span at the Conder place on the Nestucca and the new contractors are busy assembling their outfit.

The county had the concrete work on this bridge completed several months ago and it is unfortunate for them that the original contractor failed to live up to his contract, for all the surfacing material must come from the Cloverdale quarry for

the Beaver to Hebo job and the old Conder bridge is unsafe for heavy hauling equipment.

The new quarry plant 1-2 mile north of Cloverdale will be operating by the first of the month.

This plant will operate double shift to speed up completion of several surfacing jobs before the fall rains set in.

Gravel is being placed on the Daniels-Werschul cutoff and it is hoped to have this road open to travel before winter.

The tideland road is practically all rocked. A little rough now but will be in good shape as soon as a broken wheel is replaced on the steam roller.

The Neskowin road is in good shape having been patched and some planks removed.

The crushing plant on Boulder creek for operations on the Blaine road will be operating in a few days.

The Cloverdale warehouse for housing county equipment is completed and like the one at Nehalem is something new in type of structure for this purpose. It is not a shed but a real classy building and an asset to the community and it cost no more to build.
