BOYS' AND GIRLS' CLUBS PREPARE FOR FALL CONTEST

Special pig showing contests will be held next fall at all county fairs, state fair and the Pacific International Livestock show, to be open to all members of boys' and girls' pig clubs who show purebred pigs of any recognized breed. Heretofore very little attention has been given by the judges to the manner of showing the animals.

Judges will consider 50 per cant or preparing the pig to show under the following points: condition of et and trimming of toe; trimming of ears and tail; washing and clean-liness of ears, belly, head, and flanks; and condition of coat, including glass, excess of oil, and use of objectionable materials. The re maining 50 per cent will be based on the showing of the pig, including control of animal by the exhibitor; poise and coolness of exhibitor; skill in showing, including continuous attenton, keeping the pig placed to advantage, and being on the job; and ability to stand, move or drive
