**BOYS AND GIRLS' CLUBS
PREPARE FOR FALL CONTEST**
Special pig showing contests will be held next fall at all county fairs, state fair and the Pacific International Livestock show, to be open to all members of boys' and girls' pig clubs who show purebred pigs of any recognized breed. Heretofore very little attention has been given by the judges to the manner of showing the animals.
Judges will consider 50 per cent for preparing the pig to show under the following points: condition of feet and trimming of toe; trimming of ears and tail; washing and cleanliness of ears, belly, head, and flanks; and condition of coat, including glass, excess of oil, and use of objectionable materials. The remaining 50 per cent will be used on the showing of the pig, including control of animal by the exhibitor; poise and coolness of exhibitor; skill in showing, including continuous attention, keeping the pig placed to advantage, and being on the job; and ability to stand, move or drive the pig as requested by the judge.
The American Jersey Cattle club is giving \$2500 in cash for prizes this year, to be divided among the county clubs at county fairs in the fall. The clubs will be divided into two classes. Class "A" with a men-
