#### DEMAND FOR REGISTERED JERSEY SIRE INCREASES

The Smith-Umpqua Cow Testing association is the first in the state to report 100 per cent in the use of registered dairy sires at the head of the herds. Every dairyman in the association has a registered Jersey

sire in service. The association was organized in 1918 and the members have made continuous progress in breeding and feeding their herds since that time.

The average production per cow during June was 874 pounds of milk and 41.35 pounds of butterfat. The honor cow was "Lady" a grade Jersey, owned by Roberts and Sons, of Reedsport, which produced 1569 lbs of milk and 83.10 pounds of butterfat. The highest average yield in a herd was 1199 pounds of milk and 55.05 pounds of butterfat, made by the 19 Jerseys, also owned by Roberts and Sons.

Oregon hop crop all sold to English brewers, bringing about \$3,000,000.

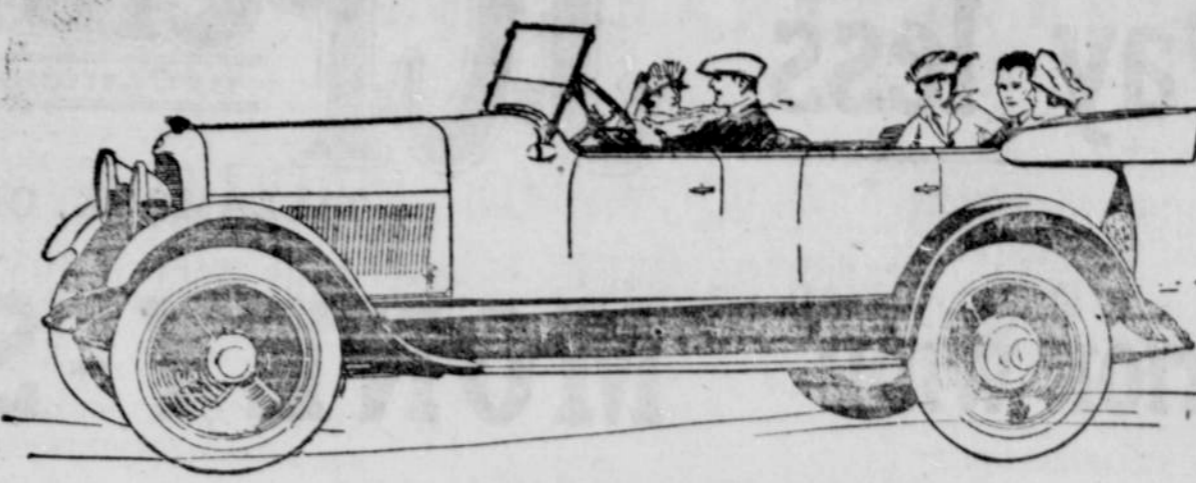
