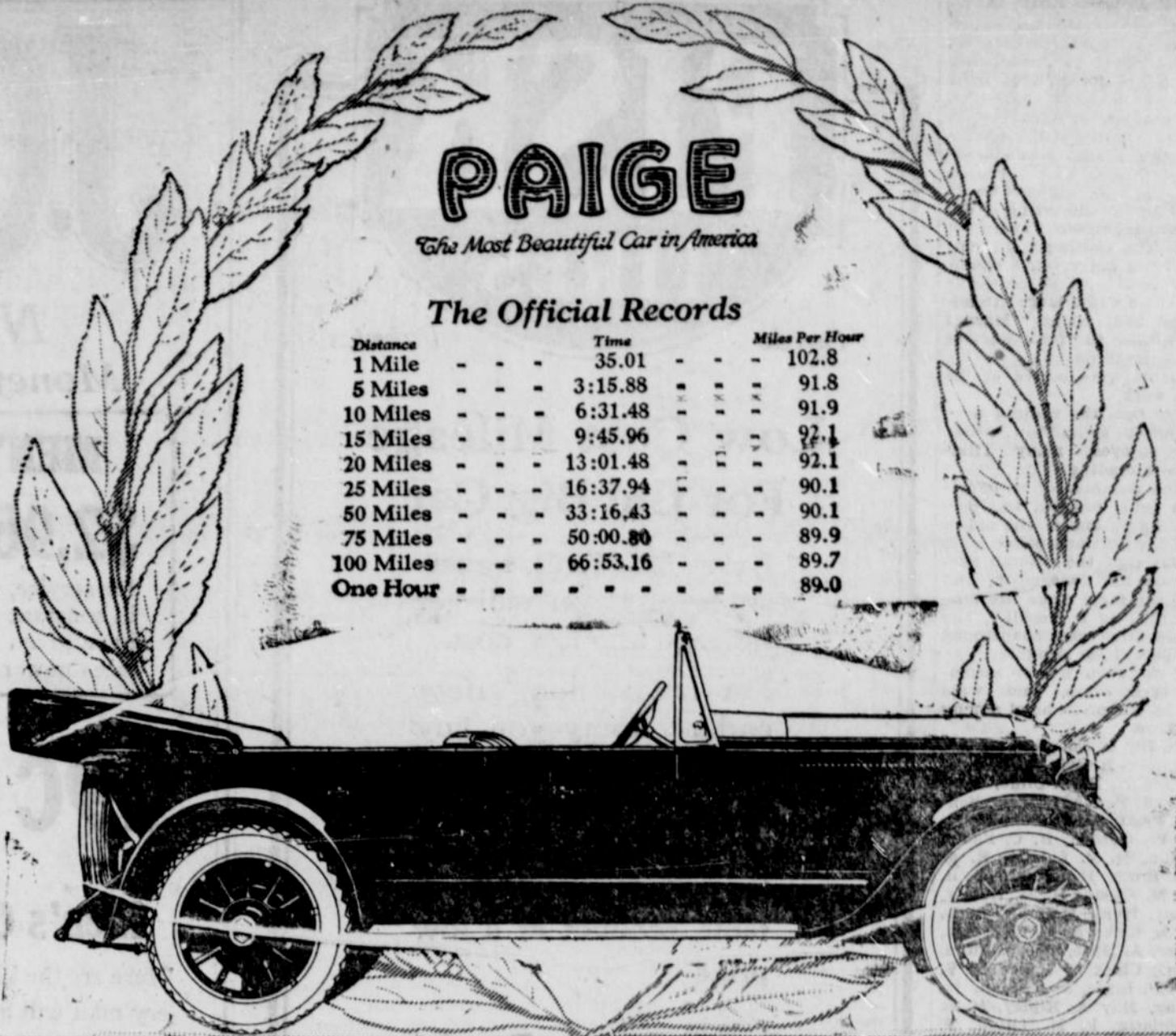

Where Guernseys Originated

Guernsey cattle originated on the island of that name in the English channel. On this island there was less opportunity for mingling all kinds of cattle, so they gradually became very uniform. In 1819 the island people passed a law preventing the importation of any other cattle. About the same time Reuben Haines of Pennsylvania imported to the United States the first Guernseys. A few small shipments were later made, but not until fifty years ago did Americans begin to appreciate the value of these "yellow and white" cattle with the rich yellow milk.
