TILLAMOOK COWS SHOW HIGH SCORES FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1921

REPORT FOR MONTH OF JUNE High grade cow owned by P. J. Tillamook Cow Testing Association Sent July 5, 1921 by Peters & Hall, Testers, Secretary, Paul Fitzpatrick.

Average pounds milk per cow 1921 average pounds butterfat 44.00. Number cows tested during month 1117. Number cows producing over 40 lbs. fat 689.

Three high pure bred herds are: John Schild, 24 cows, 1509 lbs. milk av. 51.24 lbs. B. F. average, pure bred Guernsey. Age 8 years, fresh 2 months. Months record milk: 1599 lbs. Fat: 97.54 lbs.

Five unprofitable cows were disposed of during the month. Seven pure bred cows and heifers were purchased by members at a sale of Jerseys. One more pure bred bull was added to a herd. There are forty eight members in the association now and forty seven of them are using pure bred sires. Figures show that feeding some grains pay in the long run as the grain fed herds are holding out well while those not receiving grain feed have dropped heavily in production the last two weeks.

One of the best records of the association has been made by Princess a pure bred Holstein owned by A. J. Rogers. This cow completed her 1 month. Months record 1698 lbs. milk, 86.60 B. F.
