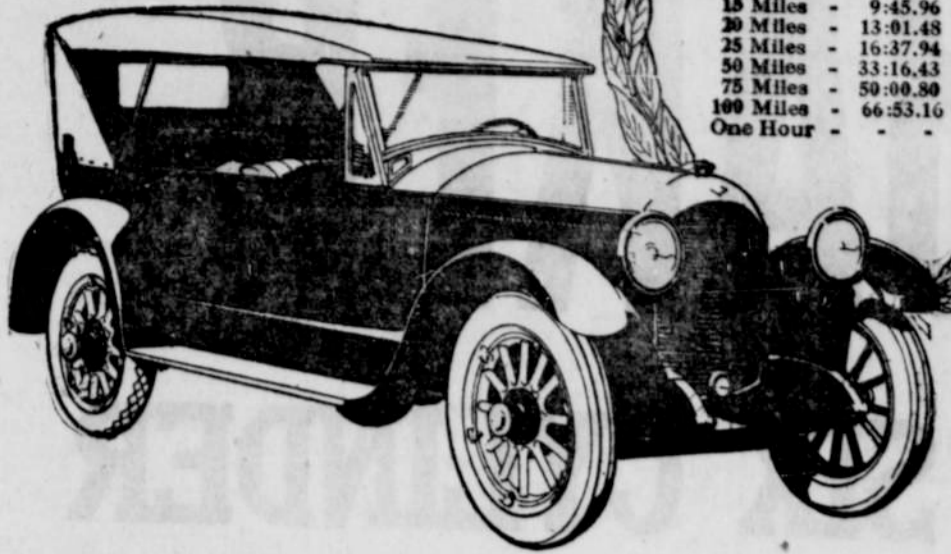

Another heart rending ocean tragedy was enacted on this coast on the night of August 7th, when the steamer Alaska, on the run from San Francisco to Portland, ran upon a rock at Blunt's reef near Eureka, California. One hundred and thirty-one passengers were on board, but the number drowned will not be known for several days. Many Portland and valley people were aboard the ill-fated ship. A dense fog prevailed at the time of the wreck.
