Dollie Agnes Sappington

Dollie Agnes, only daughter of E. J. and Alice Kellow, who died Sept. 4, 1921, was born Oct. 12, 1890 at Hebo, Oregon, where she grew to womanhood and was married to Ward Sappington. Together with her husband she leaves to mourn her loss, their little daughter Vera, age 11 years, her father, mother and only daughter Orval, also her aged grandmother, Mrs. Rhodes, all now living at Beaver, Oregon, who have the heartfelt sympathy of the entire community.

Dollie Sappington was a dutiful daughter, an exemplary loving wife, a good mother and an excellent neighbor, but she is gone to that home from whence no traveller returns and her smiles and friendly greetings are missed. Sarah Jane Elliott

Mrs. Sarah Jane Elliott, who died in Tillamook September 16, 1921, was the daughter of Webley and Mary Hauxhurst and was aged 68 years, 8 months and 15 days at the time of her death, having been born in Salem, Oregon January 1, 1853.

The deceased came to Tillamook in the late Sixties, locating on a ranch on the Bayocean sandspit, and resided in this county to the time of her death.

Her father, Webley Hauxhurst, is credited with having built the first grist mill in the Willamette valley, which was erected in 1834. Hauxhurst was later converted to the Methodist faith and became a missionary, marrying the daughter of an Indian chief.

Mr. Hauxhurst gave considerable money to assist in founding Willamette university. Mrs. Elliott, the subject of this sketch, attended the above college in her girlhood, and later came to this county with her parents. Mrs. Elliott had been in poor health for some time previous to her death.

Funeral services for the deceased were held at the undertaking parlors in this city Sunday afternoon by Rev. C. L. Dark of the Methodist church. The choir was composed of Mrs. C. E. Trombley, Mrs. Lloyd Edwards, T. H. Goyno and Todd Abrams.

The deceased is survived by her

husband, Frank N. Elliott, two daughters, Mrs. Esther Morris and Mrs. Ruby Armstrong, and one son, Webley Elliott. Two sisters, Mrs. Mary Day and Mrs. Esther Bramer, and one brother, Joseph Hauxhurst, also survive her.

The death of Robert Watt, who has been seriously ill for the past two months and a half, occurred this (Thursday) evening. Funeral services will be held Saturday.
