 Winnie May Houser vs. Alvin J. Houser, divorce; decree for plaintiff E. B. Johnson et al vs. F. N. Wilson et al, case dismissed; settled.  
 Charlie A. Hanna vs. Nora Loreta Hanna, divorce; decree for plaintiff; care and custody of children given to plaintiff.  
 State vs. Wm. Tomlinson, carrying concealed weapons; fined \$100 and costs. Defendants to be paroled on payment of \$29 and costs, during good behavior.  
 Oregon Investment and Mortgage Company vs. Albert Johnson. Ordered that plaintiff recover \$375 with interest and attorneys fees with order for sale to issue.  
 George Kiger and Geo. Williams vs. Wheeler Lumber company. Ordered and adjudged that plaintiffs recover \$4147.72 with costs and disbursements.

**TESTING ASSOCIATION REPORTS FOR MONTH OF SEPTEMBER**  
 The report of the Tillamook Cow Testing association for the month of September is as follows:  
 Average pounds of milk per cow, 661; average pounds of butter fat per cow, 39.99; number of cows tested during the month, 1195; number of cows producing over 40 pounds of butterfat, 159.  
 Two highest purebred herds: Homer Mason, 14 cows, average pounds of milk 735; J. Sharp, Guernsey, with month's record of 1377 pounds of milk and 65.95 pounds of butter fat. High grade cow, owned by Frank Hediger, Jersey, with month's record of 1194 pounds of milk and 74.93 pounds of butterfat.  
**INDUSTRIAL REVIEW**  
 Portland—A general improvement in lumber business in the northwest, resulting in the reopening of a number of mills, the putting on of additional shifts at other mills, and the announcement of plans for re-opening of at least one of the larger logging camps reported.  
 Pendleton—Approximately 3,000,000 bushels of wheat sold by Umatilla county farmers, 50 per cent of crop.  
 Bridge across Columbia river at narrows above The Dalles planned.  
 Cottage Grove—Power plant plans large fuel reserve to provide against six week's shut down of mill.  
 Cottage Grove—Woodard mill resumes operations.  
 Hood River—Work to begin on bridge across east fork of Hood river on Mount Hood loop highway.  
 Hubbard—New store opens.  
 Astoria—Prices of milk delivered in city advanced from 8 to 12 cents per quart.  
 Albany's new cleanser factory to open soon, employing 25 men.
