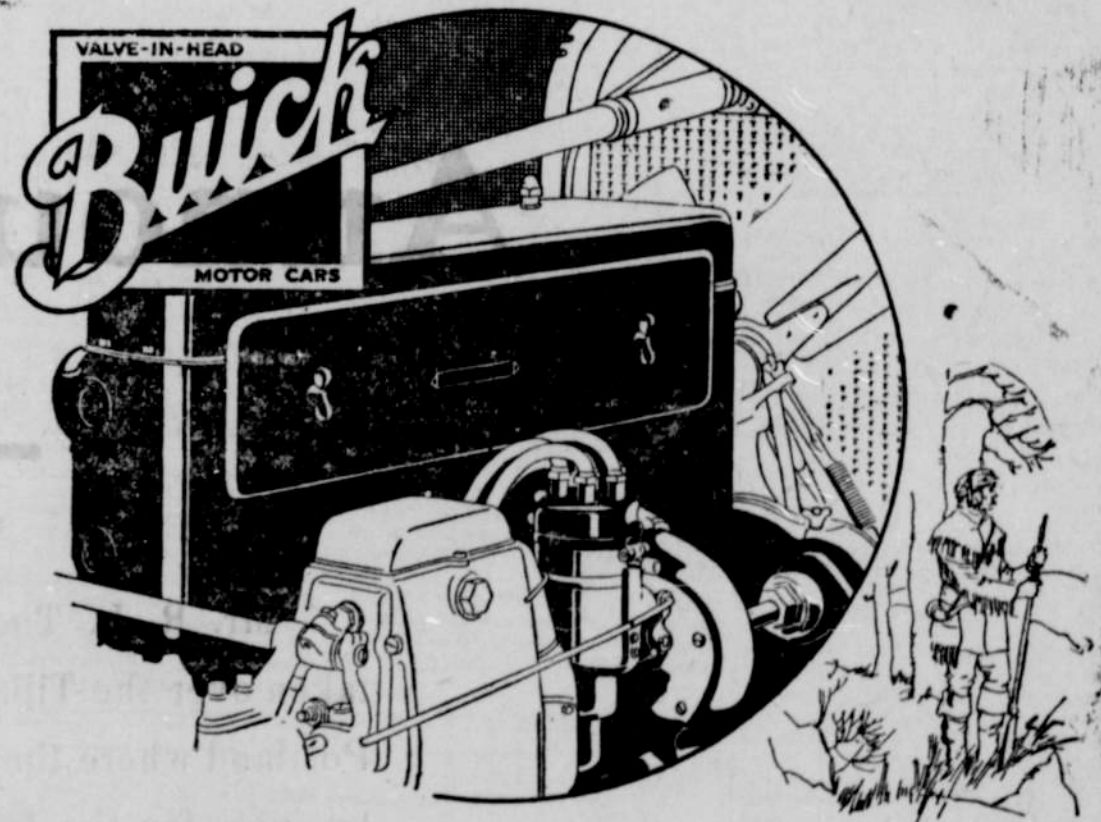
Notice of District Road Meeting in Road District No. 1, of Tillamook County, Oregon, for making a Special Tax Levy.
