**"UNCLE JOE" SORRY WHEN
TELEPHONE "GOT" VAIL**

When, at the age of 33 Theodore N. Vail left the Railway Mail Service to become manager of the new Bell Telephone company, his Washington friends stood aghast, among them "Uncle Joe" Cannon, according to Albert Bigelow Paine in his new book "In One Man's Life."

"Vail resigned his place!" he exclaimed when told about his young friend's decision. "What for?" "Why, he is going into that thing invented by Bell—the telephone that talks over a wire. He has invested some money in it and is going to make it his business."

"Well," said Cannon, "that's too bad. I always liked Vail. Hubbard tried to sell me some of that stock. I'm sorry he got hold of a nice fellow like Vail."

Later developments proved that, for once in his long and picturesque career, "Uncle Joe" had guessed wrong.

GOT HOLD OF THE WRONG CAN

A fire occurred in the blacksmith shop adjoining the Burford transfer company at about 11:30 Monday last. The firemen responded with chemical extinguishers and put out the blaze. The origin of the fire was peculiar. The blacksmith had a can which he used for pouring water into the slack tub. By mistake he got hold of the wrong can and shot the tub with gasoline, adding more water later. He then used a piece of paper to light his pipe from the forge and tossed the still lighted paper over his shoulder, when it fell into the slack tub, and then things happened. The gasoline blazed up and the flames got into the woodwork around the forge. He then phoned to the department to bring down a chemical extinguisher. The department responded with two, and got the fire out. The next time the blacksmith will turn in a general alarm.

A PRETTY PICTURE

The Tillamook coast is famed for its scenic beauty—both beach and mountain. Saturday last, the sun shone through a rift in the clouds and illuminated the mountain range north of Wilson river for a few moments. Against the blue atmosphere of the range a terra cotta field of frost-killed fern shone half way up the hills, and added to this was the gray of the alders and the green of the firs, forming a pretty picture of combined tints, that compelled admiration from the lover of nature. All the scene lacked was the presence of an artist. In time the great landscape artists will find much in our mountains and on our beaches worthy of preservation in their art.

Get Rid of the Mole Pest

Chas. Ray of Cloverdale, is in earnest about ridding his ranch of moles. He is paying 25c for each mole caught on his place, and the school boys of that section are making good wages, while the moles are disappearing in a corresponding ratio.

A general war is being waged in the Cloverdale section, since the County Agent demonstrated on that subject recently at the Cloverdale school. If every farmer and dairyman would imitate Mr. Ray and thus help in the mole campaign, within two years there would not be a mole left in Tillamook county.

Any dairyman or rancher who really wishes to get rid of the mole pest, should get in touch with his nearest school, as there will be found some boy or girl who has taken up the trapping proposition ready to go to work. This does not necessarily mean that one has to pay a head bounty of 25 cents, but arrangements can be made with such children for a sum commensurate with the time and skill used in trapping.

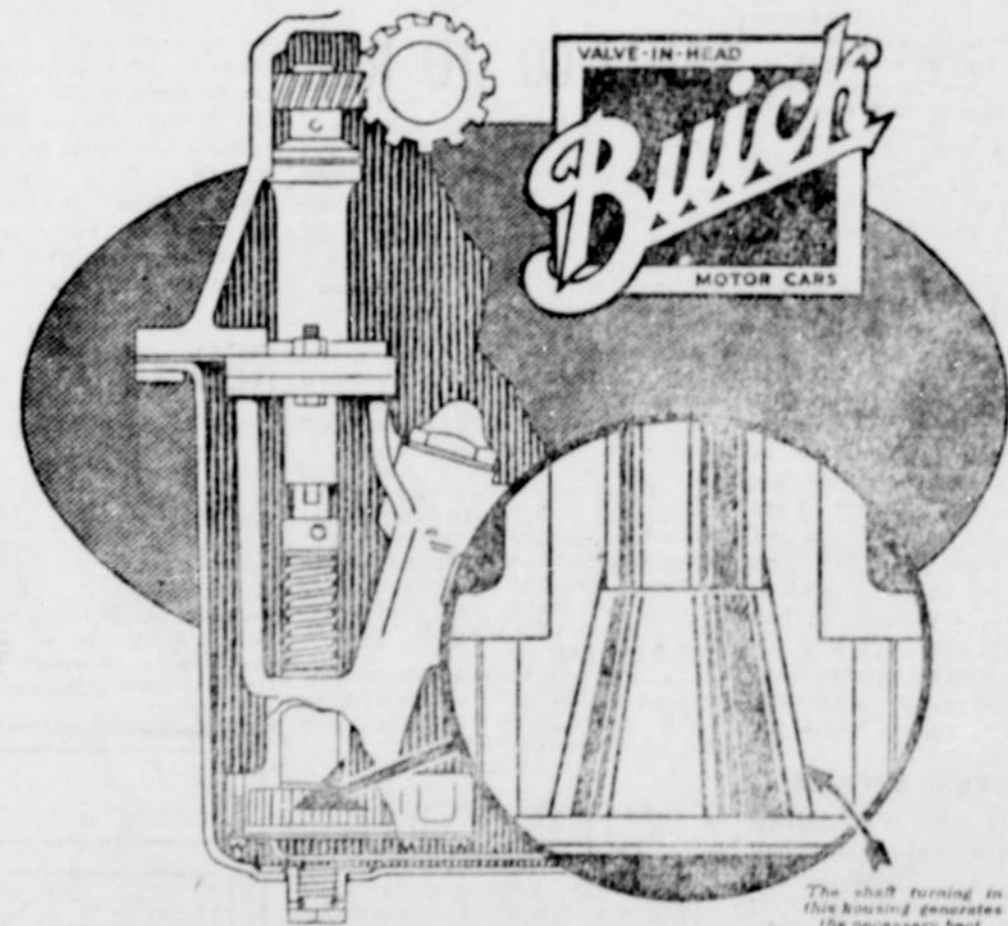
