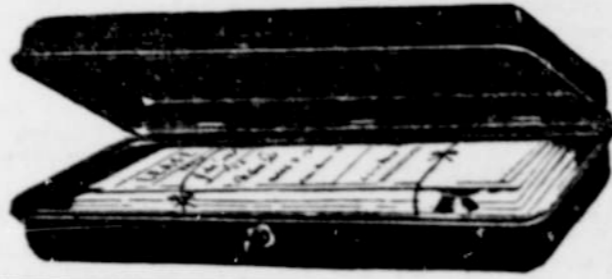
Verne Bain of this city was recently elected president of the Philodorian society of Willamette university at Salem.
