ORDINANCE NO. 418

An Ordinance entitled an Ordinance providing for the regulation, taxing and licensing of certain persons, occupations and trades, providing a penalty for a violation thereof, repealing Ordinance No. 200, 285, 299, and declaring an emergency.

The people of Tillamook City do ordain: Section 1: It is hereby made unlawful, except as hereinafter provided, for any person, firm or corporation to sell or dispose of or take order for the future sale and or delivery of any goods, wares or merchandise within the corporate limit of Tillamook City, unless said person, firm or corporation shall have first secured a license from the City Recorder, as herein provided.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall not apply to any bona fide merchant of Tillamook county who disposes or seeks to dispose of any product raised by him upon his own property or any property held by him under lease.

Section 3: This ordinance shall not apply to any bona fide merchant within the corporate limits of Tillamook city, who is a bona fide resident.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall not apply to traveling salesmen engaging in taking orders from bona fide merchants.

Section 5: Any person, firm or corporation proposing to sell or dispose of goods, wares or merchandise, or disposing of same, except as hereinafter provided, shall first secure from the City Recorder, as hereinafter provided a license, and for said license shall pay to the City Recorder the sum of \$5 per day or fraction thereof per individual for said license.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for not less than five nor more than thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment, provided that in the default of the payment of the fine imposed hereunder, said party shall be imprisoned in the City Jail at the rate of one day for each \$2 of said fine.
