BARNESDALE ORGANIZES A COMMUNITY CLUB

Cutting T. B. Out of Cattle Herds

Bovine tuberculosis eradication work is progressing rapidly in Oregon. State and federal men are working along both the accredited herd and circumscribed area plan. There are already nearly 100 accredited herds in the state located in 19 counties. Fifteen counties are engaged in circumscribed area testing and others will start the work in 1922.

The department of agriculture report for September shows a total of 2590 accredited cattle in Oregon with 6,805 herds comprising 67,273 cattle under government supervision. One thousand three hundred and fifty herds totalling 13,500 cattle are on the waiting list.

Oregon stands in seventh place in the United States in number of cattle under state and federal supervision and is second in number of cattle once tested. The appropriation for this work is far less in Oregon than in most other states. Washington has more than double the Oregon appropriation and California about ten times as much.

The splendid results secured in this state have been possible only through the close co-operation existing between state and federal inspectors, county farm bureaus and the college extension service.
