OBITUARY

John J. Earl

John J. Earl was born near Albany, Linn county, Oregon, on July 10th, 1851, and died at the home of his nephews, Jesse and Ed Earl, about four miles southeast of Tillamook, Monday night, January 16th, 1922, aged 70 years, 6 months and 6 days.

Deceased came to Tillamook in 1864 at the age of 13 years, and has made this county his home for 57 years. He followed the occupation of farmer during all these years, remaining unmarried.

For the past 10 years he has made his home with his two nephews, Jesse and Ed Earl. He was stricken with paralysis about eight years ago, from which he had partially recovered. About two weeks ago he became ill and showed symptoms of a slight stroke. On Monday night, last, the end came, and the immortal spirit of John Earl was called to the God who gave it. He is survived by none of his father's family.

Several nieces and nephews living in various cities of the northwest, survive their uncle. He was pioneer of this Tillamook county, and helped to subdue the wilderness and make our county what it now is. He will be remembered, and his passing mourned by the surviving pioneers of that early day.

Services were held at the undertaking parlors, Rev. C. L. Dark officiating, with interment in the Odd Fellows cemetery on the 18th inst. C. L. D.
