#### HINTS FOR HOUSEWIVES

When cutting materials on the bias it is the part of wisdom to lay the goods smoothly on a sewing table. Pin, if necessary, so as to avoid any danger from slipping or pulling.

#### Economical Shampoo.

Do not throw away bits of toilet soap. Keep a jar to put them in. Make bags of fine cheesecloth four by six inches. Fill with bran, a few bits of the soap, and, if you have it, a pinch or two of orris. Tie the bags at the top; do not fill them full as the bran swells in the water. Oatmeal may be used as well as

bran. These bags make the nicest kind of wash rags.

Another use for the bits of soap is to put some of them in a jar and pour in alcohol or cologne, not quite enough to cover the soap. This will make a jelly which will be found useful in shampooing or in the bath, as it dissolves quickly in the water. Add a few drops of lavender or rose to the alcohol and soap just before using.

#### Removing Shine From Serge.

Ounce of rump ammonia and half ounce white castile soap, put both in jug and pour over them one pint boiling water until they are dissolved. Then wipe the suit with a sponge dipped in the preparation, which should be slightly warm, or take piece of new black crinoline and wet it, then lay over cloth and

press with very hot iron. If the iron is hot enough it will make the crinoline adhere to the serge. You must pull the former away quickly as you would a plaster and this will raise the nap of the serge so that it looks dull again. The shine is created by the nap being pressed down so flat, so it will be seen the usual plan of rubbing with a liquid is only a temporary remedy. It removes the gloss but the nap is still flattened.

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF

##### CITY LIBRARIAN

City Librarian Mrs. Don Gilbert, and Treasurer Mrs. Geo. Kiger, submitted their annual reports for the year 1921, to the Board of Directors of the city library, at the last meeting of the Board held January 18, 1922. The board verified the report of the librarian, and audited the report of the treasurer. The board published its report Monday.

Report of the Librarian:  
The circulation of the City Library for the year 1921 was more than double that of 1920. The largest daily circulation was 134 volumes, largest monthly circulation 1333 volumes. Total circulation for the year was 12,506 volumes. There were 395 new books added to the library during the year, 76 of which were donations.
