Another Royal Suggestion PIES and PASTRIES From the NEW ROYAL COOK BOOK

Custard Pie
1 cup pastry flour
1/2 teaspoon Royal Baking Powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
1/2 cup water
Sift flour, baking powder and salt; add one-half shortening and rub in lightly with fingers; add water slowly until of right consistency to roll out. Roll out very thin; put on in small pieces remaining shortening; fold upper and lower edges in to center; fold sides in to center again; roll out thin and put on pie plate.

Custard
3 eggs
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 cups scalded milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
Beat eggs, add sugar, salt, flavoring and milk very slowly. Line pie plate with paste made as above, and bake in very hot oven about 15 minutes. Pour custard into the baked crust and bake in moderate oven about 25 minutes. The pie is done when a knife put in center of custard comes out dry.
Cocoanut Pie is made the same way, adding 1 cup of shredded cocoanut, and using only 1 egg.

WHEREAS, The State Game Commission of the State of Oregon is desirous of protecting the trout inhabiting the waters of Trask River, for a distance of 800 feet below the dam across said River near the State Fish Hatchery, situated in the County of Tillamook, State of Oregon;

THEREFORE, By authority of law vested in said State Game Commission of the State of Oregon, under Section 8, Chapter 66, Laws of 1921, notice is hereby given that the waters of Trask River, for a distance of 800 feet below the dam across said River near the State Fish Hatchery, situated in the County of Tillamook, State of Oregon, are closed to fishing of any kind or in any manner, for trout or other fish, from and after the date of this order.

And it is and shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill or fish for trout or other fish in the above described waters from and after the date of this order until said waters are again reopened by the State Game Commission of the State of Oregon.

Any and all persons whomsoever so taking, catching, killing, or fishing for trout or other fish in said described waters in violation of this order will be prosecuted as by statute provided.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TILLAMOOK CITY, TILLAMOOK COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 18th day of March, 1922, as in this resolution provided:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

An Act

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10, 1919, and to amend all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF TILLAMOOK CITY that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith", filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, and as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10, 1919, and as amended by all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter IX to read as follows:

CHAPTER IX

1. For the purpose of procuring funds with which to pay and redeem the present warrant indebtedness of Tillamook City, consisting of warrants numbered General 2731 to 3093 and District No. 10 232, 264-274 and District No. 12, 299-302 and District No. 18, 391-395 and District No. 19, 370-373 and 378-381 aggregating approximately \$50,000; each and all of which said warrants are hereby expressly validated, the Council of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or one thousand dollars (\$1,000) each, duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder, whereby Tillamook City shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of six per cent (6 percent) per annum payable semi-annually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of Tillamook City, Oregon, said bonds to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise fixed by the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date; the principal and interest of said bonds to be made payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, which said bonds shall be known as "Tillamook City Funding Bonds", which bonds shall be sold by the Council as in its judgment may be best.

2. The proceeds derived from the sale of the said bonds shall be paid to the City Treasurer, and the surplus, if any, over and above the amount necessary to redeem the aforementioned warrants with interest shall be paid into the general fund; provided however, that in the event that the amount realized from the sale of the said bonds shall be insufficient to redeem said warrants, the general fund shall be drawn on to make up such deficit.

3. It shall be the duty of the City Treasurer to see to the proper application of the funds derived from the sale of said bonds, and the purchaser or purchasers thereof shall in no event be responsible or charged with the proper application of the funds derived from the sale thereof.

4. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

5. The Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for the hereinabove proposed charter amendments, the following ballot title be and the same hereby is adopted, to-wit:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

An Act

To amend the charter of the City of Tillamook City, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893 and to amend all subsequent amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people by adding Chapter IX authorizing the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$50,000 bonds of said City to fund outstanding warrants, providing for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and interest thereon.

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of Tillamook City for submission to the legal voters of said City at a special election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 18th day of March, 1922. The polls for the receipt of ballots shall be open at the hour of 8 o'clock a.m. and closed at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. on the aforesaid date.

The following named place, to-wit: City Hall be and the same is hereby designated as the polling place for said election, and the following named be and they hereby are designated and appointed as and for Judges and Clerks of election, to act at said polling place for said election on said date, to-wit:

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Recorder be and she hereby is instructed and required to publish the hereinabove proposed charter amendments submitted to the legal voters by the Council in the manner required by law; that is to say, by publication of this resolution in full in The Tillamook Headlight, a newspaper published in Tillamook City, in two consecutive weekly issues, the first publication to be within the thirty days preceding the election, and the last publication to be at least fifteen days prior to the said special election.
