BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TIL-LAMOOK CITY, TILLAMOOK COUN-TY, STATE OF OREGON, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 18th day of March, 1922, as in this resolution provided:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUB-MITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

#### An Act

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tilla-mook City, in Tillamook County. State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893, as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10. 1919, and to amend all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEO-PLE OF TILLAMOOK CITY that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Tillamook City, in Tillamook County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith", filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 13, 1893, and as amended by the legal voters at an election held July 10, 1919, and as amended by all subsequent acts amending said act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter IX to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER IX

For the purpose of procuring funds with which to pay and redeem the present warrant indebtedness of Tillamook City, consisting of warrants numbered General 2731 to 3093 and District No. 10 232, 264-274 and District No. 12, 299 302 and District No. 18, 391-395 and District No. 19, 370-373 and 378-381 aggregating approximately \$50,000; each and all of which said warrants are hereby expressly validated, the Council of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50. 000), said bonds to be in denominations of five hundred dollars (\$500) or one thousand dollars (\$1,000) each, duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder, whereby Tillamook City shall be held in substance and effec to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of six per cent (6 percent) per annum payable semi-annually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of Tillamook City, Oregon, said bonds to be the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date; the principal and interest of said bonds to be made payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, which said bonds shall be known as "Tillamook City Funding Bonds", which bonds shall be sold by the Council as in its

judgment may be best. 2. The proceeds derived from the sale of the said bonds shall be paid to the City Treasurer, and the surplus, if any, over and above the amount necessary to redeem aforementioned warrants with interest shall be paid into the general fund; provided however, that in the event that the amount realized from the sale of the said bonds shall be insufficient to redeem said warrants, the general fund shall be

drawn on to make up such deficit.

3. It shall be the duty of the City Treasurer to see to the proper application of the funds derived from the sale of said bonds ,and the purchaser or purchasers thereof shall in no event be responsible or charged with the proper application of the funds derived from the sale thereof.

4. The debt limitations contain ed in the charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

5. The Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, incl in such levy a sum sufficient to pa interest on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for the hereinabove proposed charter amendments, the following ballot title be and the same hereby is adopted, to-wit:

# CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUB-MITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

To amend the charter of the City of Tillamook City, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 13, 1893 and to amend all subse quent amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people by adding Chap-ter IX authorizing the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$50,000 bonds of said City to fund outstanding warrants, providing for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and in-terest thereon.
