To the Editor:

Dear Editor: I promised in my former letter to write you more of my trip. March 2nd, we started out for the day, went to San Barnadino, thence out to Arrowhead Mt. Now this mountain derives its name from the fact that when the Creator formed it he must have been angry inasmuch as he formed as complete an arrow head out of a mountain as any savage Indian ever made. And not only drew the arrow head but put boiling springs at the foot of it. The government has taken it over as a home for the sick and disabled men of the world war and are making a very beautiful resort or home for them. From there we went to Patton where California has a home for the feeble minded. We inspected this institution and it is a beautiful place. From there we went to Redlands. Am sorry to say that north of Redlands the deciduous fruits are killed but the orchardists are fertilizing and doing all they can to keep life in their trees. Redlands is the most beautiful town that we have visited so far. After leaving Redlands we went out over the Yucaipa pass over into Yucaipa valley. Now Yucaipa valley might be described as an upland valley, it is several hundred feet above Redlands. This is called the Apple Orchard of California. They raise apples, pears, cherries, apricots and peaches and grapes. We visited a packing house and were shown through it. They had but little left in stock. Yucaipa is a prosperous little hamlet and is surrounded by fine orchards. When we left and got in the car and released the brakes the car started without the assistance of the motor and we coasted over three miles. On our way back in passed through Redland's south outskirts and found on the south of the city that the fruits weren't hurt much. Coming along we ran out of the fruit section and there saw a large dairy farm they irrigate from an artesian well on this farm and raise alfalfa. This brought us around south of the Carlton Portland Cement Works. Will write again soon. S. A. Moulton.

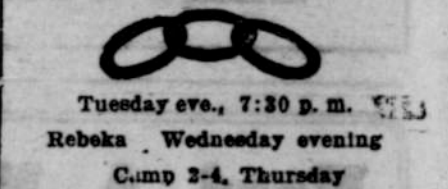
