Mr. Nunn also stated that Oregon would be the first state to finish the Roosevelt highway through its entire length, and that the counties along the route, the government and the state would cooperate in pushing the work to completion as fast as possible. "As to results," said Mr. Nunn, "I leave that to your imagination; but this much I will say regarding it: It means almost unbelievable development for the whole coast region, which will come out of its obscurity, owing to lack of good roads, and take its place along with the valley, plus its splendid advantages and resources." "And let me add," he continued, "that you people of Tillamook county, owe a whole lot to the persistent hard work of your county court."

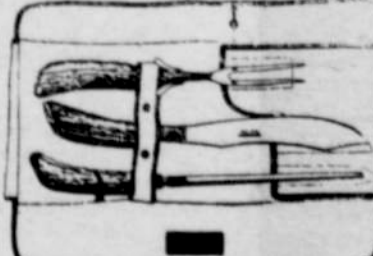
