Will you permit me space in which to correct the error which is entertained by some of the people of this school district, number nine, relative to the number of school directors to be elected at the Annual meeting to be held on Monday, June 19th.

I think this misunderstanding came about through a discussion with several people regarding the County Unit plan of administration. I think I stated to several people that if that measure should be voted upon and adopted in the County a second class school district such as the Tillamook City district would automatically become entitled to elect five school directors at the following annual school election.

There will be but one director to be elected by the voters of the Tillamook City School District at the annual meeting next June.
