### CHIROPRACTIC LEADER WINS GOLDEN RULE MEDAL

Awarded by Prominent Editor



The committee appointed by Napoleon Hill's Magazine has awarded the Napoleon Hill Golden Rule Medal to Dr. B. J. Palmer, head of the Palmer School of Chiropractic, of Davenport, Iowa.

The medal is the first of a series that will be awarded to those who are rendering the greatest service to humanity based upon the Golden Rule. The purpose of the award is to popularize the application of the Golden Rule to business and industry.

The decision to award the medal to Dr. Palmer was based largely on the number of votes he received. He led the other three chief candidates by more than 150,000 votes, many of which came from foreign countries, Japan, Italy, England, Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

Woodrow Wilson ran second to Dr. Palmer and then followed Harriet Luella McCollum, the lecturer on Applied Psychology.

The gold medal was designed by the well-known sculptor, Adolph Wolff. On one side were the words: "The Greatest Among Thee Shall Be the Servant of All." On the reverse side, "B. J. of Davenport, for Serving the World Through Chiropractic."

Dr. Palmer's popularity was due to the spread of Chiropractic which was discovered by his father, D. D. Palmer, and developed by himself. Doctors of Chiropractic and their patients from all over America and from many foreign countries literally bombarded the editor of Napoleon Hill's Magazine with telegrams, letters and special petitions, requesting that Dr. Palmer be awarded the first medal, which convinced the committee that he was the popular choice.

This is the first medal ever offered for service to the world based upon the Golden Rule. A similar medal will be awarded periodically as a means of directing the attention of the world to the possibilities available to all who apply the Golden

Rule in their business and professional dealings. The plan was originated by "Golden Rule Hill," who began his career in the coal mines of West Virginia and gives the Golden Rule credit for his rapid rise to an influential position in American journalism.

When interviewed at his office in New York City Mr. Hill said: "I am proud to see Dr. Palmer win the first Golden Rule Medal. It proves that the world is not slow to recognize the reward service that is based on the Golden Rule. My personal preference, perhaps, would have been for Harriet Luella McCollum, who is also delivering the Golden Rule Message to thousands of people, but the committee felt that it ought to be guided by the wishes of the people, and Dr. Palmer's followers were so far in the lead that they could not be ignored."

"I believe the world-war carried us into a new era of human relationships in which we will understand that it is expedient to apply the Golden Rule in all business transactions. Surely the war taught us the futility of combat and strife, and if civilization is to justify itself we are now ready for a spell of decent treatment of each other as we tarry by the wayside of life."

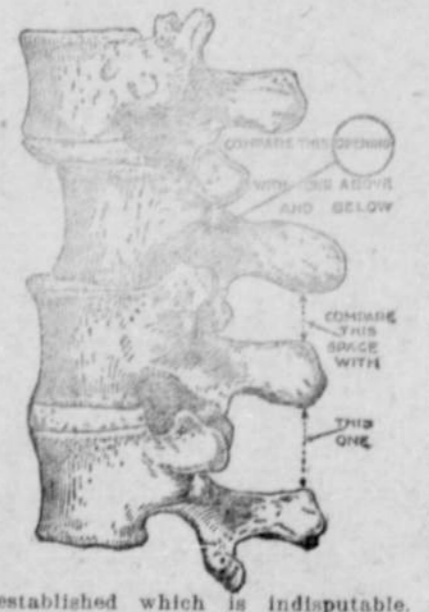
