transfer animals, identifying the young stock, and the many other details that go to keep in good order a pure-bred herd, can fully realize the importance of an at-all-times-available source of concise and complete data on the herd. It is a recognition of this present day need of the ever increasing number of enthusiastic dairy cattle breeders that inspire the development of this complete loose-leaf pocket dairy herd register and record book. It is applicable to all breeds of dairy cattle.

The cover of the book itself may be of the ordinary cloth binding or of the more expensive and durable black levant. The leaves are a good grade of white heavy paper which has been selected with an idea of withstanding abuse. Altogether the Pocket Herd Register and Record Book is an almost necessary adjunct to the modern dairy cattle breeder.

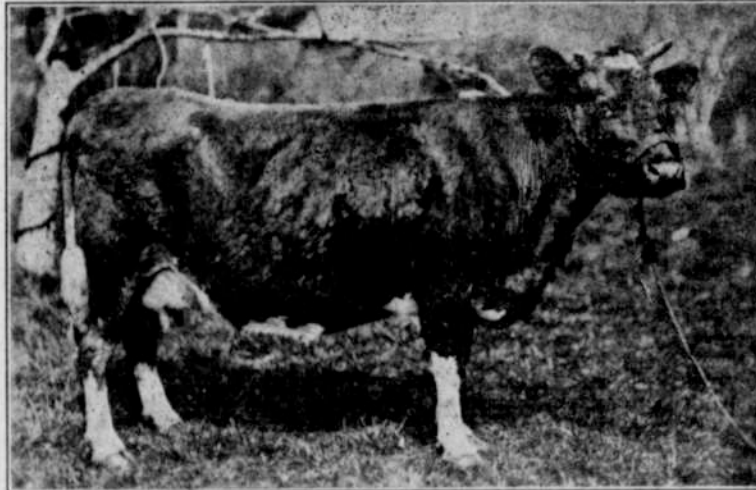
