In 1885 the family moved to Tilamook County. After the death of her husband as stated above she continued to live alone for a number of years. But for more than twenty years she has made her home with her children. About seven yers ago her health began a marked decline, and since that date she has been a great sufferer especially toward the end of her life.

At the age of 23 she became a Christian and was babtized and united with the Babtist church. She lived and died in the faith thus early confesed. When she came down to the Jordan of death: knowing that the crossing must be near, she arranged for her departure, saying goodbye to all and pledging all her friends to meet her over there where sickness and parting ar no more. All of the surviving children were at her bedside at her death save the youngest son who was on his way.
