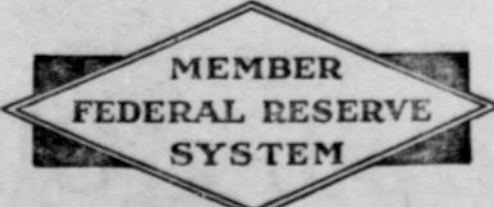

Eighteen club members from Tillamook County attended the Boys and Girls' summer school at Oregon Agricultural College. These members came from Hebo, Beaver, Nehalem, Mohler and Tillamook, the majority coming from the vicinity of Tillamook. The Tillamook Jersey Calf Club sent four members, Edwin Glad, Allen John Krake, Nadine Williams and Laverna Achley. The Tillamook Guernsey Calf Club sent four members, Kenneth Williams, Gerald Krenshaw, Lenhart Glenger and Bryan Morgan. The Skookum Canning Club sent five members, Gwendolyn Harris, Marjorie Tucker, Lucia Wiley, Muriel Wiley and Lavelle Baker. The Pleasant Valley Dairy Herd Record Keeping Club sent one member, George Blum. The Mohler Garden Club sent one member, Leslie Young. The Mohler Calf Club sent one member, George Ludtke. The Beaver Sewing and Cooking Clubs sent one member, Vera Sappington. The Hebo Garden Club sent one member, Neil Bodyfelt.

At the final stock judging contest held on the last day, Allen John Krake made the highest score, over all. In this contest over 100 boys judged Jerseys, Holsteins, Hampshire sheep, Shropshire sheep, Durco-Jersey hogs, Berkshire hogs, Herford cows and Shorthorn yearling heifers.

In the stunt show, Tillamook took second in competition with fourteen other counties. In this stunt show, Marjorie Tucker and Gwendolyn Harris gave a fairy dance, Edwin Glad sang and the county group did a serpentine with a large Tillamook cheese in a go-cart.

The boys had class work from nine to twelve o'clock. Their schedule was: Tuesday, beef judging; Wednesday, sheep judging; Thursday, poultry, two hours and vegetable gardening one hour; Friday, poultry, gardening and soils, one hour each. Saturday, poultry tour, two hours and farm crops one hour. Monday, the 18th, dairy judging; Tuesday, hog judging; Wednesday, milk and cream testing, two hours, corn two hours; Thursday, bacteriology one hour, potato growing, two hours, soils one hour; Friday, judging of 8 classes of livestock, every one entering.

The girls' summer school schedule will be published next week.

The Tillamook Guernsey Calf Club will meet at Highland Grove farm Saturday, July 1st, to judge Holstein cows. All Guernsey club members should be there as members returning from summer school will report at this time. The Guernsey Calf Club had four members attending summer school, Kenneth Williams, Bryan Morgan, Gerald Krenshaw and Lenhart Glenger.
