Sergeant Bates left yesterday morning with the enlistment papers of fifty four men, enough to get federal recognition. The unit will be formed in about three weeks or one month.

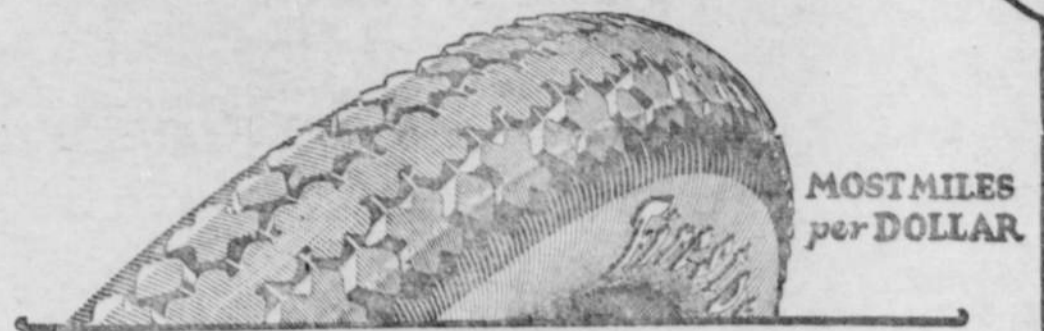

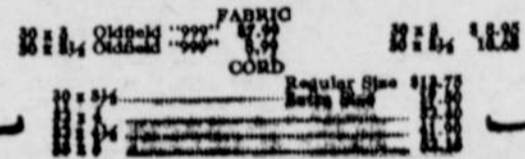
