Friction consumes power and develops heat and wear

Sometimes friction is utilized. In the automobile the

friction of the clutch transmits the power of the engine to the rear or driving wheels, the friction of the tires and

the road surface propels the machine, and the friction of the brakes stops the car. Friction should be confined to the parts named (the clutch, the tires and the brakes), if
