What's all this fuss about the recent primary election, anyhow? Under the old convention system, when they used to hold political conven-

tions in the old court house, republicans did not dare poke their noses into a democratic convention. And it was the same thing with a republican convention, democrats had the good sense to keep away and not interfere. Although a great deal is said about corruption in the old convention plan, people were politically honest in those days and did not butt in and endeavor to control nominations in the opposite party.
